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2003—A Big Move For K&L

This year will see the fourth relocation of our San Francisco store—from Balboa Ave in 1986 to 768 Harrison in 1991 to 766 Harrison in 1996 to 638-4th St in 2003. We think this will be the final move in San Francisco because we love this new location. Only a few blocks from our Harrison Street store, this building has 7000 square feet of total space and over 4000 square feet of selling area—bigger than the Redwood City store. More space and much more visibility as well as a better parking area are some of its good points. I like that it is very close to Pac Bell Park (for those with season tix) and three great restaurants—Bizou, Fringale, and Bacar. We are very excited about the interior design of the new store and therein lies the problem. In years past Todd and I would get a new location, throw in some shelving and a cash register, and start selling. We were outvoted this time by several people, so we hired an architect and a builder, pulled permits, etc. The whole nine yards. We delayed opening in November and plan to be in the new digs by March. On paper, the store looks beautiful with a large, comfortable, sales floor, wide aisles, attractive racks, a nice tasting area, and plenty of storage in the back (with possible room for wine lockers). We'll let you know the exact date of opening as well as our grand opening sale dates. Until then we're at the mercy of the City of San Francsco planning commission and all the bureacracy that goes with it. Stay tuned! — Clyde Beffa, Jr

Any Port in a Storm

We'e in the midst of an El Niño like winter here in Northern California. Perfect weather for vintage port and I have my favorites. Try the **1996 Burmester LBV** for everyday sipping, only **\$8.99.** Tons of sweet fruit and a lingering finish.

On special occasions, try the great value ports from 1985—Quinta do Noval (\$38.99) and Smith-Woodhouse (\$39.99). The Quinta is on the elegant side and the Smith has power. For that super special occasion you must try the super sweet, delicious, other worldly 1977 Graham (\$89.00). As good as a great port gets. Happy rainy winter! —Clyde Beffa, Jr

They possess lovely balance that ensures that they will age nicely for 3...5...7...10 years, and they were purchased with a very strong American dollar. The beauty of all of this is that every wine is a lovely drink and tremendous value.

The following are three of the best value wines from 1999. Château Smith-Haut-Lafite, Pessac (\$28.95) is a warm, richly-textured wine with waves of ripe, semi-dark purple fruit, hints of smoke, earth and wood. Smith can be drunk young and over the next 10 years. Just as the great second growth 1999 Château Ducru-Beaucaillou, St-Julien (\$45.95) will. What a treat this wine always is. It's never overextracted. Brimming with red fruits and minerals, the wine has a silky texture and is so full of finesse that it's hard to resist drinking now. Perhaps the best non-first growth wine from the entire vintage is Château Léoville-Barton, St-Julien (\$36.99). This uncompromising wine is also a model of consistency in style—loaded with masculine, deep, dark blue-purple ripe fruit. On the palate, it is bold and expansive, with hints of spice and vanilla, firm grip, and through all of this the wine retains its elegance. In my 20-something years here, I've purchased more wine from this property than any other Bordeaux property.

The Beast is on its way and that would be the 2000 Bordeaux vintage. Clear out some long-term storage space in your cellar for the bigger names—they will develop for many years. 2000 could be the 1961 of our new wine world. The quality and power of the vintage is fantastic. How about some proof? Let's start in an area all Bordeaux lovers should be well aware of—Lalande-de-Pomerol located just north of Pomerol. Grapes have been grown here for over a 1000 years and with no more land to plant in Pomerol, this area is emerging as a great spot for superb value. **2000 Château Haut-Chaigneau (\$17.99)** is a big chunky merlot with great fruit and very tasty; even under tough conditions, like the pouring rain in the Candlestick Park parking lot!

Two new arrivals that are big time K&L favorites are back in stock. Throw the vintage chart out the window for 1994 Château Angelus, St-Emilion (\$ 67.95). This wine may be the Wine of the Vintage on the right bank in 1994, and I've adored it since my first taste at the château in 1995. The exotic opulence, which many seem to emulate but few seem to achieve these days is featured here. Flavors of roasted meats and ripe merlot and cabernet franc fruit have natural expression on the palate and are integrated perfectly with the wood. Also back is probably my favorite luncheon wine in the last few years, 1996 Domaine Gartieux (\$19.99), the third wine from Château Pichon-Longueville-Comtesse de Lalande. Only made in great years like 1996, when the quality is exceptional in every way. It's perfect, even with salmon and white fishes.

Trey's Corner!

Let's start with a couple of wines we haven't seen for about a year here at K&L. The 1999 Frazier Merlot (\$32.99) and the 1999 Frazier Cabernet Sauvignon (\$39.99). Planted in 1990, the Lupine Hill Vineyard is the major source of fruit for the two wines. The 1999 Frazier Cabernet shows a dense, dark ruby color, and an intense nose of blackberries and cassis with hints of smoke and spice. In the mouth the wine is an explosion of fruit with hints of spice, minerals and dark chocolate. This wine will age well in a cellar over the next 10 years and should be decanted if you intend to drink now. The Frazier Merlot exhibits aromas of fresh blackberries, plums and smoky oak, while in the mouth the wine shows flavors of currants, berries, cloves, vanilla and nutmeg. The finish is long and firm but not harsh. The wine will continue to develop over the next 5 years. The Merlot received 93 points from 'The Wine Enthusiast' in the November 15th Issue! Artesa has a new Cabernet release in the 1999 Alexander Valley (\$28.99)! For those of you who missed the 1999 Napa Cab from Artesa be sure not too miss this wine. It will not be around long. Also new reds that are worth mentioning include the 1999 Estancia Alexander Valley Meritage (\$29.99) and the 1999 Franciscan Napa 'Magnificat' (\$39.99). Both are excellent Bordeaux blends from California that can be enjoyed now. Also this month look for the following new releases here at K&L: 1998 Silver Oak Napa Cabernet Sauvignon, 2000 Melka Metisse, new releases from Heitz, including Martha's and Bella Oaks, and the 1999 Paradigm Cabernet Sauvignon. Big Oaky Chards

Once again it's time to return to the basics, and show off a few of our best classic California chardonnays. Like good comfort food, family and babies, a rich buttery chard makes you feel warm and fuzzy inside. These wines are just plain good to drink, and most do not need long cellaring to enjoy. As you probably know, I search for great wines at great values to provide relief from overpriced labels, and I have found a few for you this month.

The **2000 Heitz Napa Chardonnay (\$12.99)**, from one of California's most prestigious and family run wineries, is a medium weight chard with ripe apples and pears, a moderate amount of oak and a nice finish. This wine has all the hallmarks that made chardonnay a California wine staple, this is a very solid wine for a great price.

Stepping up the weight a bit, yet still in the medium weight category is the 2000 White Oak Chardonnay, Russian River (\$12.99), another great value. This wine is fatter and riper and shows a more rich coconut creaminess to the lightly toasty oak. It is pretty, round and has a bit of tropical lushness to the fruit. Forward and open, it's a great crowd-pleasing chard, perfect for parties. Even bigger is the fat and ripe 2000 Sanford Santa Barbara Chardonnay (\$13.99). Full of plump tropical fruit and a big dollop of oak, this is the quintessential California chard, and a really showy wine. For those of you charmed by a full creamy buttery chard, you can't beat this deal.

To top off the list, the **1999 Chalk Hill Sonoma Chardonnay (\$28.99)** is a hefty chard, full of ripe apple and peach fruit, smoky toasty oak and a long, long finish. This wine is always a favorite with everyone from reviewers to novice drinkers, and is so rich and full it can accompany a rich winter meal, or make an extraordinary cocktail wine, yet will age nicely for a few years.

Jim C's View Down Under

I feel a little like "Chicken Little." Not because the sky is falling, but all the way from the northern hemisphere, one of Jim's Gems has fallen "down under" into my lap! The **2002 Kirkham Peak Sauvignon Blanc** (\$9.99) from New Zealand is the first wine under our label to come from another country. The region of Marlborough on the south island offers one of the greatest and most unique expressions of sauvignon blanc in the world. The wine has the classic nose of gooseberry, lime and grapefruit, followed on the palate with juicy acidity and some mineral notes. Good texture with fine balance and length. This is a GREAT VALUE that could only happen when two worlds and two Jim's collide.

2001 Bleasdale Verdelho Langhorne Creek Australia (\$9.99) Check out this crisp, refreshing fruit-driven wine. The wine was tank-fermented and aged, so it's all about the clean fruit notes of citrus and peach. On the palate, there is moderate acidity, good depth of flavor, and a hint of spice. Mr Parker gave it 87 points. P.S. Don't miss their Shiraz-Cabernet that Parker scored 88 points.

2001 Clarendon Hills "Brookman" Cabernet Sauvignon (\$39.99)

I was fortunate enough to taste this vintage out of barrel with Roman Bratasiuk in January 2002. His wines have remarkable concentration, balance, and purity. He has a judicious hand with new French oak, and he bottles without fining or filtration. Robert Parker has called Clarendon Hills one of Australia's most exceptional wineries. The Brookman vineyard was planted in 1940, and this offering shows the depth of old vine fruit. The bouquet has elements of black cherry, cassis and violets that are framed by light toasty oak. On the palate there is great balance with fine integrated tannins and a long finish. This will reward the patient collector, but if you can't wait, decant a few hours.

2000 Capcanes Costers del Gravet, Monsant (\$15.99) 91 points from Parker, in his Anti-Greed issue: "This blend of 50% cabernet sauvignon, 40% grenache (from 70-year-old vines), and 10% carignan was aged completely in French oak before being bottled unfined and unfiltered . . . This medium to full-bodied, impressive, and long wine will benefit from an additional 4-6 months of bottle age. It should drink well for 8-10 years." Run, don't walk to get this truly "heroic" red!

2000 Capcanes Val de Calas, Monsant (\$19.99) This great Monsant red is a blend of 70% merlot, 20% tempranillo, and 10% garnacha. More approachable than the Costers del Gravet, the Val del Calas has a bordeaux-like finesse about it. Try this red with grilled lamb loin.

2000 Capcanes Cabrida, Monsant (\$46.95) This 100% grenache from the Monsant region is vinified for approximately 28 days to extract the most from this 100-year-old vine fruit. This red is full of ripe blackberry fruit, exotic spice, and ripe tannins. From the heady aromas, to the richness on the palate and the long finish, the Cabrida will bowl you over with its style and sensuousness. A must buy for the Rhône varietal lover!

1999 Capcanes Pansal del Calas, Monsant (\$13.99) Finally, a sweetie to round out the Capcanes set. Made from a blend of 70% grenache and 30% carignane, this red is fortified like a port. Sinfully rich and delicious, enjoy the Pansal with rich chocolate truffles or some of Spain's famous Manchego or Cabrales cheeses.

Jim's Gems: Valentine's and Anderson's Day

Yes, Anderson was born on February 14, Valentine's Day, last year. And a great relationship between he, Ebby, and I was begun when this feisty Brittany Spaniel was picked up from the breeder in June. Well, almost great; Anderson has learned that Ebby uses her sharp long claws if his exuberant puppy behavior gets out of control.

Well, Dr Klutz isn't done, yet! One of his many discoveries in Burgundy, a declassified red from Domaine Heresztyn, **Bourgogne Rouge** (\$15.99) behaves more like one of his single vineyard Gevrey Chambertins than a simple regional bottling. But, when we latch onto this type of wine from such a quality oriented small producer, stand back! It will rival Bourgogne Rouges that are two to three times its price. This is a distinctively stylish pinot that provides medium-deep ruby color, old style, rustic characteristics of game, meat, dried rose pedals on the nose, excellent fullness of body, wonderful complexity, balance, and a deeply warm finish (Pay attention, Marsha!). Both Burghound.com and Clive Coates (The Vine) have raved about this wine, and Anderson thinks this may be one of the models that we will have to fashion our Anderson Valley Hillside Pinot after.

The Usual . . .

So here we are in 2003, no big deal, same as it ever was. Every day that I get older (usually Tuesday through Thursday), I realize that all of the changes that I had hoped would be affected in my lifetime—local mass transit, electric cars, the new Beatles, large biceps, etc—probably won't be and that has to be all right and you go with what works today (run on sentences seem to be my thing at the moment) and darn the torpedoes, the heck with the Joneses (I could never keep up with them anyway) and bring on the screw caps, good cheap wine, and the hopes that the folding wine glass invented by Nigel Tufnel of Spinal Tap will become a reality, or at least as close to reality as is humanely (yes, humanely) possible. Hopefully, you've all held fast to those New Year's resolutions, I know that I have—I'm a volunteer at the local A&W, a seeing-eye Manatee trainer for cave fish, a Big Grandson to a wayward senior and I read Herman the Snot-Nosed Caboose to over-privileged children—but hey, I'm just doing my part. Don't forget, it's the little things that make a difference, and it doesn't get any littler than this.

Whilst your loving domestic wineries play *Honey, I Shrunk the Morals* with ridiculous pricing for sometimes suspect products, mature bordeaux seems to be a bit of a bargain at the moment. Case in point: 1992 **Château Angelus**, a fabulous success in a difficult vintage, is a concentrated, fleshy, ripe and seductive wine that is absolutely perfect right now. With a bouquet of warm black fruits, allspice and chocolate, this stellar showing is a grand example of why the Château has vaulted to prominence in the last 15 years. (note to unnamed California winery: it is ALL estate fruit, not 98% purchased grapes with estate grown pricing).

Whoa, pardoner! Let's ease up a bit and have some big fun—and big fun, thy name is **1982 La Lagune**. Considered one of the "Burgundies of Bordeaux" for its lush texture, opulence, and fine balance, La Lagune tends to walk the tightrope. When wine falls short of perfection (which tends to be vintage related) there can be a tannic edge and a bit of shortness to the fruit flavors . . . not bad, mind you, but enough to put it in the middle of the pack. When the vintage is world class like this 1982 is, the wine becomes ethereal—the lushness of the red and black fruits are like preserves, framed by oak that gives it a Graham cracker nuance. Decant and leave it for an hour or two. It is phenomenal.

Fellow geek Doug Kardash was trotting a bottle of dessert wine around the store the other day, making everyone guess what it was. I guessed wine, but he wouldn't let me off the hook. We knew (at least) that it was sensational, with very bright, high acidity, a bouquet that only hinted at the complexity it would gain down the road. It was old, we knew, but not too much so. Why Mr Kardash was willing to open a bottle of his **1990 Château d'Yquem** for the likes of us I'll never know. But if you are willing to pony up for what is truly the world's greatest dessert wine, here is your chance. d'Yquem is so head and shoulders ahead of the pack, it's not even a contest. Now Doug doesn't get teased for at least a week.

One final note. As Mr Jim Barr appears to be getting married in August to a wonderful gal who suffers only from bad judgment, we at the K&L have been tasked to pick the wedding song. We'd love to have your suggestions. Here are the final six: "Break on Through to the Other Side," The Doors; "I Should Have Known Better," The Beatles; "Ring of Fire," Johnny Cash; "I'd Hate to Be You on that Dreadful Day," Bob Dylan; "Submission," The Sex Pistols; "The Last Time," The Rolling Stones. February Sherry

A few months ago, I met a customer in the Redwood City store who made a big impression on me. He had come in to buy some sherry, and explained that 30 years ago, when he was in college and first getting into wine, wine people were interested in trying everything available. He said he was tired of watching everybody (including himself) drink a narrower and narrower selection of wines in a time when more wine than ever was available. I've found a wine that is as different from the mainstream as it can be, the Barbadillo Obispo Gascon **Palo Cortado (\$39.99)**. Fashion dictates that wine ought to be dark, dark red, but the Obispo Gascon is a white wine that has gone to brown in the barrel. New oak flavor is in vogue but at Barbadillo they season new barrels with their lowest quality wine to prepare them for future use (after the oak flavor has been eliminated) with higher quality wines. Big, bold and fruity describe the powerhouse wines that are all the rage right now, but subtle, nuanced, and complex would be the best way to describe the Obispo Gascon. This is truly great wine. The average age of this wine is about 40 years; most current release wines are three years old at the most. Are you curious? This completely dry, restrained wine is worth a shot! Loire Valley: February Finds

This month I must introduce you to two new (to K&L) small producers from the Loire Valley. The first is a Vouvray producer Thierry Nerisson, who is actually the head sommelier at Tours' top restaurant, the two star Jean Bardet. He rents certain vineyard sites, does all the work himself, limiting yields and working as naturally as possible. He then rents an area of the chai and makes the wines himself on the property. A Vouvray that is classic but can be enjoyed now by the adventurous. Forget everything about sweet, cloying Chenin Blanc and get into this **Thierry Nerisson Vouvray Sec Souple (\$13.99)**, a pure, vibrant wine full of fresh pear, apple, and stone aromas, that is rich and ripe, clean and perfectly dry. Next, Domaine Daulny in Verdigny is making some top notch Sancerre that is a steal. The **Domaine Daulny Sancerre**, Clos de Chaudenay Vieilles Vignes (\$13.99) comes from a parcel of 50-year-old vines grown in soil with a high content of chalk. It has a deft balance of racy minerals, high-toned grapefruit, apricot and herb aromatics, and a texture that is silky and juicy. A superb example of what old vines and dedication can bring to the bottle.

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Pour Votre Plaisir

February is here, and the effects of the disturbance at the West Coast ports continue to be felt. Many wines expected to arrive in November and December are rolling in late January, so I'll try to fit as many in the column as possible. Of course, for the latest and most complete list, check www.klwines.com.

From **Domaine Paul Pernot** we have several lovely whites. The **2001 Bourgogne Blanc** (\$17.99) has a rich nose, and a very Puligny-like style for a small price. The **2001 Puligny Montrachet** (\$37.99) is racy and long, with bright fruit. The **2001 Puligny Montrachet**, "Folatières", 1er Cru (\$59.95) shows peach and nectarine notes, more richness and lots of charm. The **2001 "Pucelles,"** 1er Cru (\$69.95) shows the low yields and old vines. Much closer to Grand Cru concentration, with richness and oiliness on the palate. The **2001 Bienvenues Bâtard** (\$105) is reserved and extraordinarily long and mineral-laden. Almost like a Chevalier Montrachet, while the **2001 Bâtard Montrachet** (\$119) is sweet, sexy, opulent and could only be Bâtard. 92-94 points from Tanzer.

Red Burgundies include 2000 Domaine Michel & Frederic Lafarge. The Passetoutgrain (\$12.99) is charming, fresh and eminently quaffable. The **Bourgogne Rouge (\$19.99)** is from 40-yearold vines, and much more Volnay than Bourgogne. The **Volnay** (\$39.99) has more depth and length, as well as the supple fruit characteristic of the 2000s. The Volnay Vendanges Selectionées (\$44.99) shows balance and harmony, as well as the effects of the change to biodynamic farming. We also have tiny amounts of the Volnay Clos du Château des Ducs, the Volnay Clos des Chênes, and the Pommard Pezerolles (each at \$76.99). Also due are the 2000 Domaine Comte Armand wines, including Volnay Fremiets, 1er Cru (\$57.99), a lovely wine with lots of elegance and depth, and Pommard Clos des Epeneaux, 1er Cru (\$73.99), an earthy and relatively forward version of this wine with lots of fine tannins and ripeness. The use of the triage table really paid dividends here. Finally, (at least as far as space permits . . .) we are getting the 2000 **Jacques Frederic Mugnier** wines. He is always one of my favorite producers, and he felt that his 2000s were as good as his 1999s, a rarity in the Côte de Nuits. The Chambolle Musigny (\$46.99) is a blend of Chambolles Les Plantes 1er Cru and Combe d'Orveaux. One vineyard lies adjacent to Chambolle Charmes, and the other adjacent to Musigny—not bad for a village wine, eh? The Chambolle Musigny "Fuées", 1er Cru (\$71.99) and the Chambolle Musigny "Amoureuses", 1er Cru (\$124.00) are always an interesting contrast. As Freddie Mugnier says: "Fuées is of the earth and Amoureuses is of the air." "Fuées is ripe, long and harmonious", while Amoureuses is "sexy, long and altogether impressive for the vintage" (Allen Meadows, Burghound.com). Tiny amounts of Bonnes Mares (\$115) and Le Musigny (\$162) are also arriving.

Sotto la Pergola Inclinata

I'm sure all of you are anxiously awaiting the release of the 1997 Brunello di Montalcino Riserva; chances are there will be some good wines among this release. I will be in Montalcino this month to taste the new releases, to battle the cold, and to eat wild boar for 4 courses per meal. I will be looking to spot the stars of the vintage early. If any of you follow the critics you'll know, after two glowing reviews for Montalcino in the Wine Spectator and Tanzer's International Wine Cellar for 1997 Brunello, Robert Parker came out and said that the "vintage's excessively inflated reputation" was cause for caution. Scores as you know are highly volatile and personal de gustibus non disputendum (matters of taste are not to be argued), hence it is not at all surprising that there is a diversity of scores. Brunello more than any other wine I have ever tasted is singularly, without a doubt, the most difficult to taste. The Spectator had tastings early when bottles were shipped to James Suckling's office in Tuscany, Edward Beltrami from Tanzer ran around to wineries, and Parker tasted in America and was the last to release his reviews this past December, except for a handful he reviewed the year before (which were all in the 90-96 pt range, perhaps tasting early catches the wines when they are tasting

better, he rated several 1998 Brunello in this December's issue 90+points). From that viewpoint alone you'd think they might have distinctly different experiences regardless of palate differences. We recognized many differences from the wines we tasted in Italy in April and when the wines began to arrive last year, shipping shock had taken hold and the wines were moving quickly into a stage of adolescence where they won't talk to anyone for a while (It's just like trying to read what's on a teenager's mind). I read a posting on a wine chat room from someone who has far too much time on his hands and compiled a statistical analysis of ratings of the three critics on 31 wines they commonly reviewed, the results were surprisingly close Parker 88.9, Spectator 91.7 and Tanzer 92.8. Reading the review of the vintages not the individual wines one would have thought there would have been far more diversity. So what to make of all of the critics chatter? As a wine merchant it is our duty to help you pick what you like, when you have Parker over for dinner and want to please his taste we can look at his book and pick something out he likes. In the meantime, let's work on what YOU like. —Greg St Clair

Ausgezeichnet Austria!

Last April Mike, Jeff and I visited a storied group of Austrian producers in a blitz-like tasting day. First off, we met Fred Loimer, one of Kamptal's premiere producers: young, vibrant, visionary and quiet, he lets his wines do the talking and they are chatterboxes! Young wines, old wines, riesling or Gruner, Fred's wines dazzled us with Kamptal richness and complexity. His everyday 2001 GV Langenloiser (\$11.99) is juicy and drinkable and his 2001 GV Spiegel (\$30.99) is stunningly complex and worth every penny. Hirtzberger is not a name one needs to say twice in Austria to impress someone: their 2001 GV Rotes Tor

Smaragd (\$30.99) has minerality that scorches across your palate only to halt occasionally to explode into white pepper spice! Rudi Pichler saved our lives this day with giant plates of wiener schnitzel on an otherwise 10-hour-straight tasting day. Thank you again, Rudi. The more famous FX Pichler sometimes overshadows Rudi's name but his wines stand out on their own. We thought that of all of the groups of wines we tasted that day his stood out as the most concise and purest expression of their terroir. His 2001 GV "Kollmutz" Smaragd (\$31.99) sings, its mineral flavored elegance interlaced with ripe fruit. Its devastatingly long finish is just spectacular. Emmerich Knoll, another legendary winemaker with the most identifiable label in the world, has produced 2001 GV Loibner Federspiel (\$17.99) with brilliant white pepper aromatics. It's lively and energetic, wiry and focused, all with a balanced and graceful feel.

A Few Favorites from Mike

Hi, I'm Mike, the new guy in San Francisco. I've been in the wine industry for about 15 years. I tend to lean to Italy as my specialty, but try to have a diverse palate in all regions and wines. I was fortunate enough to travel with Greg last year to Austria to discover the great 2001 Gruner Veltliners. One of my personal favorites is the **2001 Schloss Gobelsberg** "Kammerner Renner" (\$20.99), a full bodied wine with great depth and natural acidity. It does provide this spicy element that is beautifully encrusted by wild flower flavors. This wine has a natural affinity to seafood, but would also marry well with pork, veal, and game birds. Now, back to Italy (my apologies to Greg). 2000 Vietti's Barbera d'Asti Tre Vigne (\$15.99) is very user-friendly with plenty of cassis and mineral aromas that follow to a full-bodied and silky palate. It has wonderful concentration all the way to its lengthy finish. Another favorite is the 1999 Badia a Coltibuono. Chianti Classico at \$16.99. A steal at this price! There are intense flavors of dark cherries and strawberries with a hint of mushroom on the palate. Good tannin structure and a twist of chocolate on the finish. —Mike "The Wine Guy" Parres

Jeff's Picks: Of Soil and Spätlesen

There is nothing like a truly great Spätlese. Here the marriage of soil, site, and fruit combine in such a way that is complex yet candid, an ethereal experience that leaves you with more questions than answers. It is also a product of style. Every vintage is different, and wines labeled Spätlese will have varying levels of ripeness. The best should bring to the front the soil, the pure ripeness of the fruit, not be too racy, nor too rich and leave you in wonder, smiling of course. Try these two personalities on for size. First, the 2001 Serriger Schloss Saarsteiner Spätlese (\$17.99) from a slate vineyard high above the Saar River in the coldest of Germany's winegrowing regions, is a racy and wondrous wine full of citrus, pineapple and slate with hints of honey and wet stone all set atop a classic rigid Saar framework. Next, from the middle Mosel and a vineyard comprised of red slate and volcanic material, comes the 2001 Monchhof Urziger Wurzgarten Spätlese (\$18.99) is deep and powerful, shot through with the Würzgarten spice from the volcanic soils and layered with peach and citrus fruit, all set atop a massive structural frame of ripe acidity and earth.
