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Best Wishes for a Fine 2004

Not much room here, but I do want to mention that by the time you read this article, K&L will have finished bringing in over 99% of the fabulous 2000 Bordeaux pre-arrivals. They started to arrive in October 2002, and only a few (less than 40 cases) are still due in. Not bad for having over 10,000 cases of 2000 Bordeaux bought and processed. Hats off to our fine operations department for a job well done.

No time to rest however, as the 2001 Bordeaux started arriving in December, and we expect more than 5,000 cases to come in over the next 10 months or so. And everyone (retailers, wholesalers, importers, exporters and producers) must now follow strict procedures for bringing in beverages from foreign countries. It is part of an FDA rule to control bio-terrorism activities. Nothing for any of our loyal customers to fret about; your wines will arrive without a hitch! Just sit back and watch the year 2004 speed by.

Confessions of a Port Drinker

I am often asked the question, "What is the best wine you've ever tasted?" More often than not, my most frequent response is Port. No wine style, in my mind, conveys the subtle elegance, strength and pleasure that is found in Port. It is the wine that punctuates the finale of an amazing evening. Here are some helpful suggestions to help you punctuate future great evenings.

1975 Graham's (\$49.99) Michael Broadbent says, "one of the best of all the 1975s." The classic food pairing would be Stilton blue cheese, but if you're brave go for a rib eye steak. The richness of either of these dishes compliments the tannin structure of the wine and highlights the fruit intensity of the Port. The 2000 Smith Woodhouse, 375ml (\$24.99) is abso-bloody-lutely amazing!!! This deeply rich wine drips with ripe fig fruit, sweet spices and thick, mouth-coating tannins. The 1992 Warre LBV (\$21.99) is a wine to remember. With subtle hints of sweet cherry spice and licorice on the finish, it's a wonder that this wine isn't sold out. The 1982 Smith Woodhouse "Madalena" (\$29.99) is over the edge. Just when you think it couldn't get better, SW comes through with a wine that boggles the senses with aromas of chocolate and plum and a finish as soft as cashmere. If you are pleased by the taste of vintage tawny, grab one from the last stash of 1989 Krohn Colheita (\$19.99). This wine reminds me of cappuccino, toffee and roasted almonds. And it goes well with apple pie, fruit tarts and a variety of nut-based sweets. Happy New Year!

The New Year Welcomes a New Vintage: 2001 Bordeaux

Bonne Annee mon amis! This New Year brings us a new vintage from Bordeaux—2001, and frankly it is another very good vintage. It is without question a vintage for the real wine lover, and by that I mean it arrives under the radar of excessive hype and demand, a combination that always results in outrageous pricing. 2001 is a great value vintage, purchased before the serious decline of our U.S. dollar. We have tasted this vintage from barrel to bottle, thousands of wines, and it has performed very consistently. In November at our yearly Fête de Bordeaux tasting-dinner, which is the début of the new Bordeaux vintage at Spago Palo Alto; most people enjoyed the 2001s more than the 2000s!! This was not a surprise to us. Bordeaux has been on a great roll, opening the new century with three fine vintages in a row. And just like the last trio of fine vintages '88, '89 and '90, they are all a bit different but not drastically. The 2001s have come together more quickly than 2000 and are "set," as we say, which means they found their definition and focus early and are showing very well. The 2001s listed below, although not from the famous classified growths of Bordeaux, are fine examples of the great quality, diversity and value that the world's greatest wine region continues to produce.

On the super value side, there is no wine in all of Bordeaux hotter than the amazing **2001 Ch. Reignac (\$32.95 1.5L)**. This wine has ripe, round fruit and richness from the 75% merlot and 25% cabernet sauvignon blend. It's thick and toasty and will appeal to all California palates as well. **2001 Ch. D'Agassac (\$18.99)** is the white hottest Cru Bourgeois of them all, and it has all the qualities of expensive Bordeaux wine. A 60/40 blend of cab/merlot grown just down the street from La Lagune, it is a ripe, serious and regal tasting wine with good backbone. As its first appearance at K&L, it should fly out the door. Taste ASAP!!

Moving up, the superstar of the Cote de Bourg has always been **2001 Ch. Roc de Cambes (\$23.99)** and in 2001, this 65% merlot is a brilliantly fresh wine with flavors of zesty raspberries and impeccable balance, so tasty there is not much reason to wait. Next we move west to St-Emilion and two fine and immaculate estates, with very different styles. **Ch. La Fleur de Jauge (\$15.99)** is for the traditional old-school, right-bank lover who likes merlot with strength and definition. The flavors of black fruits with hints of tar, earth and mineral will integrate with a few years in the cellar. If new-world flash and ripeness is your style, **Ch. Ferrand Lartique (\$29.99)** is your wine. It's just loaded with layers of dark fruit and blueberry and blackberry jam flavors with new oak. It is a smooth, classy wine and very Californian in style, so it will drink superbly in its youth.

2001 Ch. Cantemerle (\$36.95, 1.5L) is one of our favorite estates in Bordeaux for value and drinkability. The 2001 is right on the money! Its unique vineyard blend of 40% merlot, 35% cabernet sauvignon, 20% cabernet franc and 5% petite verdot always produces a very consistent wine that is very charming in its youth, but with age develops a lovely warm character as well as complexity without becoming hard or tannic.

Jim C's View Down Under

2003 Mulderbosch Sauvignon Blanc, South Africa (\$17.99) This refreshing white earned 92 points and a Smart Buy designation from the *Wine Spectator*: "Crackling, live-wire Sauvignon, with textbook gooseberry, grass, lime and mineral flavors on a racy frame. Pure and long, with great acidity. Let this emerge fully in the cellar. Best from 2004 through 2006." Number 28 on the *Wine Spectator's* Top 100 List!!

2003 Lawson's Dry Hills Sauvignon Blanc, New Zealand (\$12.99)

Ripe tropical and passion-fruit aromas are balanced with crisp herbal flavors, good palate weight and a clean fresh finish. Cool fermentation in stainless steel accounts for 92% of the blend. The other 8% was fermented at slightly warmer temperatures in 1- to 5-year-old French barriques. The oak component adds wonderful structure and mouth feel, and another dimension to the wine without a strong wood influence. Just under 10% of the blend is semillon, chosen to add a nutty complexity.

2002 Lawson's Dry Hills Pinot Noir, New Zealand (\$16.99) This has

a deep ruby color, with ripe plums and cherries on the nose and palate with elegant structure, soft tannins and a long finish. Grown on the steep clay slopes of the Giles vineyard and the free-draining soils of the Collett vineyard, the grapes for Lawson's 2002 Pinot Noir were hand-picked and fermentation in open vats with traditional hand plunging, followed by maturation in new to 4-year-old barriques.

Yarra Burn Pinot Noir, Australia (\$17.99) This elegant, Old Worldstyle Pinot Noir exhibits aromas and flavors of strawberry, cherry and blueberry with the added complexity of cloves, cinnamon, truffles and forest floor. Medium bodied, with balance, texture and a long seductive finish. The Burgundian climatic conditions of the region allow Yarra Burn to produce wines of distinctive varietal character, with delicacy, elegance and intensity. This winery was established in 1975 by David and Christine Fyffe. It was acquired by BRL Hardy in August 1995, and it continues to release wines of great individuality and character.

Trey's Corner!

2004 is here, and what a year we have to look forward to! The 2001 California Cabernets have slowly started to make their way onto our shelves. The 2002 Chardonnays are all showing very well. And wine prices are holding steady. For something new and exciting this year, try a couple of wines from Elizabeth Spencer.

Elizabeth Spencer is a husband-and-wife winemaking partnership based in St. Helena. The wines are vinified using classical hands-on methods with minimal handling in small, individual lots. The 2001 Elizabeth Spencer Sonoma Coast Chardonnay (\$18.99) is a well balanced, fresh and rich Chardonnay that screams for food. The 2001 Elizabeth Spencer Napa Cabernet Sauvignon (\$25.99) is an elegant yet fleshy Cabernet designed for the table, with only a hint of oak. Both wines are superb and can be enjoyed tonight!

Speaking of 2001 Cabernets, the **2001 Caymus Napa Cabernet Sauvignon (\$62.99)** is simply tremendous. I have not been thrilled with the Caymus Napa Cab over the last few years, but this year Caymus is back! The 2001 is classic Caymus. Intense, dense and toasty, it is loaded with mid-palate fruit, something that has been missing in the last couple of vintages. This wine is drinking well now and should develop over the next five years.

The **2001 Stag's Leap Wine Cellars "Artemis" Napa Cabernet Sauvignon (\$31.99)** may have a new name and package but it is the same great wine. Artemis was the goddess of the fields and the hunt in Greek mythology, in case you were wondering. With more estate fruit in the blend, the 2001 Artemis shows deep, concentrated fruit, a full, round mid-palate and firm yet ripe tannins on the finish. This wine is balanced and shows excellent length. The wine will probably be at its peak in 5–7 years.

Four Fabulous Bargains in Winter Reds

Well, the holidays are over, and we're all just a little bit ready to get on with our lives. Of course, it is still winter, and we still need rich red wines, especially those that won't zap our checking accounts! Here is a quartet of luscious rich reds to fill this need.

My number one pick and a surprising value in the "mini cult wine" tradition is the **2002 McManis California Cabernet (\$8.99)**. It's a rich, toasty, deep and juicy powerhouse at a giveaway price. Sweet, deep, concentrated plum fruit with notes of pepper, black spices, cedar and smoke, it has a syrah-like quality. The intensity and complex layers of this wine are amazing, as is its long, long finish that just won't quit. We sold a huge amount of the 2001, and this 2002 is even better.

Next up, and another favorite around here, is the **2001 Lapis Luna California Merlot (\$8.99)**. Soft and easy with very smooth and pretty primary fruit, flowery notes and true quaff-ability, you owe it to yourself to try a bottle before it's gone!

Third in our lineup is the ever-popular **2001 Rancho Zabaco** "Dancing Bull" Zinfandel (\$6.98). At this price you can't afford not to try one. Bright and forward cherry/raspberry fruit mingle with touches of pepper. With very reserved tannins, this Zin will compliment everything from Monday night pizza to a roast chicken.

Last, but certainly not least, is the **2002 Avila San Luis Obispo Pinot Noir (\$9.99)**. How they make such a complex and true pinot-like wine for this price is beyond me, but I'm very happy they do! Very correct, pretty plump cherry fruit, delicate spices and soft tannins prove this to be a worthy contender for deal of the day! Happy 2004!

San Francisco Focus

The New Year is upon us. I would like to share with you what I think is one of the best wineries in California, **Porter Creek Vineyards**. Porter Creek was founded in 1979 by George Davis. In 1997, his son Alex took over wine-making duties and has seen the winery's reputation grow by leaps and bounds. The is one of Sonoma County's smallest producers, specializing in Pinot Noir and Chardonnay, most sold directly from the winery. Is Porter creek the next Williams Selyem? Give these wines a try and see for yourself!

Porter Creek "Creekside Estate" Pinot Noir 2001 (\$25.99) Bright, moderately saturated red color, highly aromatic, spicy aromas of black cherry, blackcurrant and bitter chocolate. On the palate it is juicy, penetrating and firm-edged, with intense cassis and mineral flavors and lovely intensity and length. Half of the 2001 crop here was lost due to spring frost, with the yield ultimately less than a ton and a quarter per acre. The result is perhaps the best vintage to date for this label. A big hit at my Christmas dinner.

Porter Creek "Timbervine Ranch" Syrah 2000 (\$23.99) Aromas of blackberry, raspberry liqueur and smoked meat, this red is juicy and deep in the mouth, with raspberry and spice flavors. Not sweet or fleshy but with plenty of red fruit, earth, smoke and meat flavors. Substantial, somewhat hard tannins will require at least a year or two of additional bottle aging or aeration if serving immediately.

Porter Creek "George's Hill" Chardonnay 2001 (\$16.99) Big, but built for food, the nose of this white is filled with citrus like lemon and lime, plus pear and many other complex aromas. Barrel aged 18 months and left unfiltered, it just might make you a California Chardonnay lover all over again! Happy New Year!

Right in Front of my Face...Merlot!

I've been so excited this past year about hard-to-find California Cabernets, hot cult Zins and delicious Rhône blends I've nearly forgotten my one true love: California Merlot. It all began on the harvest of 1996 as I drove over the hills into Napa from San Francisco for the first time. Sunroof open, windows down, Indian summer had never smelled so delightful. To this day, one sip today of the classy **2000 Chappellet Napa Valley Merlot (\$26.99)** makes my heart sing. The gorgeous ruby color immediately catches your eye, then the flavors of intense fruit, chocolate and mocha come together on the palette as the aroma of dark cherry and smoky oak lingers in the air. A very handsome wine.

Another Merlot that I rediscovered is one I can always count on for a quick dinner date. The **2000 Mill Creek Dry Creek Merlot (\$15.99)** could easily become a simple pleasure for anyone. This small producer in Dry Creek has created a medium-bodied merlot with rich plum and vanilla notes on the finish. K&L offers it at a tremendously great price, too. Very food friendly as well. From grilled salmon to rosemary-scented lamb, it'll hold its own!

Dry Creek reminds me of another simple pleasure-a bit of a surprise since I expected it to be an "average Merlot." **2001 Frei Brothers Dry Creek Merlot (\$13.99)** is one of the richest and most intense wines I've tasted for a price well under \$15. Velvety, lush fruit in each sip, and from the classic 2001 vintage.

So I dare you to branch out. Dig back deep to those wines that first made you smile and let a little California Merlot keep you warm this winter month!

2001 Domaine Triennes, Sainte Fleur Viognier (\$9.99) Classic, peach, honey and cherry blossom nose. In the mouth, a nice, crisp acidity and minerality asserts itself with notes of peaches and vanilla. It is a wonderful surprise and a brilliant alternative to chardonnay.

2001 "Exaltation," Routas Syrah (\$9.99) is another fine bargain from the Southern Rhône. This vineyard-designated wine has a classic nose of boysenberries, earth, Provençal herbs, and a slight hint of cloves. In the mouth, red plums, ripe cherries and light oak. A great wine for everyday drinking and perfect with winter fare.

2001 Domaine Croix de Rascas, Languedoc (\$9.99) 70% grenache and 30% syrah. Black fruits with heady, spicy notes. Black cherry and boysenberry fruit on the palate with a touch of white pepper. Immediately approachable and versatile enough for nearly any meal.

2001 Rasteau "Prestige," Domaine de la Soumade (\$19.99) Last November, I ecstatically wrote of a few wines from Rasteau, and these new releases from Soumade are in the same vein. A blend of 80% grenache, 10% syrah and 10% mourvèdre with fruit that is sweet and lush. Very ripe and round, with framboise and currant flavors, amazingly well-structured!

2001 Rasteau "Confiance," Domaine de la Soumade (\$28.99)

Although this wine has the same blend as the "Prestige," they are like night and day. The "Confiance" shows a wealth of red fruits with raspberry scents. It is a dense wine with violet undertones and dark red and black fruits. It drinks very well now, but can easily age for another 4-5 years. Happy New Year!

2001 Protocolo Red (\$4.99) 87 points and a Best Buy from the *Wine Spectator*! This Protocolo is a plush and spicy red, full of ripe berry fruit with a long finish. It's the perfect wine to drink with slow braised or stewed wintery dishes.

2002 Cuevas de Castilla Cuvee RS Rueda Blanco (\$5.99) 88 points from Robert Parker! He says: "If more Spanish producers begin to make whites like Cuevas de Castilla 2002 Cuvee RS (a blend of 80% Verdejo, 15% Viura, and 5% Sauvignon Blanc), the rest of the world will take notice. It is an exceptionally perfumed, dry, fruit-driven effort offering loads of citrus and tropical fruits, and a gorgeous, flower-filled bouquet."

2002 Naia Rueda Blanco (\$8.99) 88 points from the *Wine Spectator*! Made from a blend of 85% verdejo and 15% viura, the Naia is a fabulous first effort. This white is bright, fresh and lively with aromas that remind me of a fine Sancerre. Enjoy the Naia with grilled salmon and tarragon butter. The *Spectator* says: "this generous white shows melon, lime and mineral notes that are balanced and fresh."

2002 Castano Monastrell (\$7.99) 90 points from Robert Parker! He says: "A custom cuvee from importer Eric Solomon, this dense purple-colored 2002 reveals surprisingly sweet tannin as well as gobs of black raspberry, cranberry, and currant fruit. There are 10,000 cases of this soft, supple 100% Mourvèdre for the United States. A wine to purchase by the case, it will last for 2-5 years."

2002 Borsao Tres Picos Garnacha (\$9.99) Mr. Parker scored the last two vintages of this wine 90 points. The Tres Picos is made from 100% mountain-grown, old-vine Grenache. The 2002 offering is packed with ripe black cherry and currant fruit and complimented by a smattering of white pepper spice. A Rhône-lovers dream! I love the Picos with roast pork with lots of garlic!

Wine people tend to view the passage of time by wine vintages—some great, some poor, some best dealt with and forgotten, some monumental, unforgettable, like that one drive right down the middle that makes Sunday on the golf course more than just a waste of time. Wine people tend to view wine as if they are looking in the mirror. Not much seems to change from one day to the next, until...kaboom! That half case of Château X that you've been holding suddenly seems a bit long in the tooth, and you realize that it's DECADES OLD for goodness' sake, not the young pup it once was. I submit that this is as good a reason as any to avoid mirrors. This way I can always be a young Robert Redford and not Harry Potter's dad.

I'd imagine that when folks from all over call to talk wine and maybe buy a bit of it, they see banks of phones, people with headsets chattering away in their minds' eye. There are phones here, yes. And people, of course there are! But K&L is not the mail order behemoth that you might think. We aren't a bunch of sissies; we do the work.

If I buy the contents of a cellar from a private party, I'm the one who drives there, loads it, drives it back and stocks it. K&L is a hands-on operation, and we learned to like this style of business a long time ago when cleaning the bathrooms one minute and selling Bordeaux the next (after washing the hands, of course!) was not uncommon. You are always dealing with PEOPLE at K&L, and please remember that we are not a high-turnover operation. There is a level of commitment here that will benefit you, I promise you that. If anything, we are a corner hardware store (you know, the one with EVERYTHING in it) with a

Jim's January 2004(?) Gems

Every January I say this, yet it is as poignant as the last time I said it (which seems like just yesterday), and that is: "How did the new year come about so quickly?" I blinked, I think, and 2003 flew by. Is it me or does time really speed up as we get older? We did a lot last year, from selling you tons of great gems at wonderfully low prices, to surviving the holiday crunch, and to having planted "The Barr Family Vineyard" and getting married, both in the Anderson Valley, in a span of less than two months. Christine (my best friend and now wife) was wonderful through this incredible last year.

One of my major complaints about domestic chardonnays, particularly those from California, is that they are overdone. Most seem to be cumbersome, cloying, excessively oaky, with a touch of sweetness, and they don't match any food other than maybe a cheese course. Fortunately, there are a handful of producers that in my book are making world-class chardonnays that are not overdone, out-of-proportion or sweet. The **2000 Château Montelena Napa Valley Chardonnay (\$24.99)** is one of the best chardonnays available. This wine has amazing character from its opulent nose reminiscent of Arkansas black apples surrounded by mild creamy tones to its lush, full mouthfeel that exhibits superb structure and length. Remember, this winery initially built its reputation by winning the Paris tasting in the mid-1970s with its wonderful chardonnay pitted against the best Burgundy had to offer. And besides, it is not often that I get to write about a wine of this stature. Ebby says this needs tons, upon tons of points, and I agree. (

Our last container contained a familiar face: **2000 Chateau Souvenir Bordeaux Superieur (\$9.99)**. This is an absolutely incredible bargain, as has been shown by the fact that we have sold out of it twice now and have had to go back to France for more inventory. Medium deep ruby in color, the nose erupts with aromas of anise, blackberries and roasted

staff that can help with the plumbing, the electric, the foundation, you name it. A corner hardware store, that has some awfully fancy computers.

K&L has myriad buyers, but when you buy Champagne, for instance-Gary Westby GOES THERE to find small producers of high quality. Ditto Greg in Italy (and Austria), Keith in Burgundy, Ralph and Clyde in Bordeaux, Jeff in Germany, etc. Rest assured that when you dial our number you'll have a staff that is dialed in to every product. Our Wine Clubs? EVERY wine is tasted by Dave. It is not some clearinghouse for crap, or greed for profit endeavor that so many monthly clubs have become.

I usually make fun of my colleague Jim Barr in this space (and it shall continue!) but I thought that I'd chat a bit more seriously about what makes us tick as a wine shop.

One last note: At a recent function in our gorgeous new San Francisco store, I poured the **1989 Gruaud-Larose** (\$59.95), mentioned here in past months. The wine is absolutely lovely, with a still tight core of cherry fruit, an engaging earthy complexity and a tannin level that has subsided to the point of perfect balance. The wine is an absolute steal. At the same function Ralph poured the fabulous but unready **2000 Gruaud-Larose** (\$89.95), a twenty spot more than the '89. If you'd like a great old wine for tonight, give me a call. As you can see, good values can come in old vintages. And some are as handsome as a young Robert Redford. Just don't serve it in front of a mirror.

More Champagne from Launois

We just received a shipment from Launois, and included in that shipment is some of their rare and fantastic vintage wine. The Launois family has been grower-producers in Mesnil since 1872 and over the last 100+ years have developed a real cult following within Europe. When I first approached them to buy some of their wines they politely informed me that they did not have any extra to sell. Undaunted, I pestered until they gave in and sold me a little. When I saw their price list, my jaw dropped; it was no more expensive than the most drab and ordinary wines of Champagne! The total production of Launois is around 16,000 cases a year—small change compared to the 83,000 of Clicquot or the 2 million of Moët, but large for a family operation that uses only the grapes that they grow on their own land. They are Veritas certified organic, and the lavish attention that they give their vineyard is apparent in every bottle. I feel that these wines tell the story of the famous village of Mesnil every bit as well as Salon and Krug, but at a very small fraction of the price.

We offer the Launois "Cuvee Reserve" Brut Blanc de Blancs (\$24.99), made primarily from the 1998 harvest with 10% 1997 reserve wine and four years on the lees after an all stainless-steel vinification. This Champagne has gorgeous polish, flavors of pine nuts and a long mineral finish. We also have the Launois "Sable" Brut Blanc de Blancs (\$25.99), which is made in a cremant style with half pressure. It is the same make up as the reserve, but because it only has three atmospheres instead of six it comes across as softer, richer and more generous. Strangely enough, the lower pressure is barely noticeable. Finally, we have 35 scant cases of their 1997 Launois Brut Blanc de Blancs (\$29.99), which is ready to be put into a blind tasting with Salon or any other top Blanc de Blanc. This wine has extraordinary concentration and a wonderful tension between ripe Chardonnay fruit and scintillating Mesnil minerality. The very warm and ripe 1997 vintage lends an extra element of richness to this precise Champagne. Mulan's Musings

Attention s'il vous plait! If ever there was a time to pick up a few bottles of Alsatian wine it would be now! The latest release of wines from **Domaine Charles Baur** have arrived, and they are, as my French auntie would say in her super cute accent, su-bleem! This small domaine is located in the quaint Alsatian village of Eguisheim, and produces wine from about 30 acres of vines, eight of which are located in the Grand Cru vineyards of Pfersigberg and Eichberg. The Eichberg Grand Cru faces southeast and is composed of limestone and marl, interspersed with bits of clay and small stone. Only riesling, pinot gris and gewürztraminer are permitted in this Grand Cru vineyard, and after tasting the 2002 Charles Baur Riesling Grand Cru Eichberg (\$18.99) I understand why. Nuances of peach, Kaffir lime, and guyaba are absolutely intoxicating. This is a spectacular example of Alsatian Riesling, which would complement a fresh Dungeness crab or perhaps Vietnamese shrimp spring rolls. The **2000 Charles Baur Gewürz**traminer Grand Cru Eichberg (\$18.99) is very racy and oh so clean! Ruby grapefruit, jasmine blossom and lychee are popular descriptors for the varietal, and this one's got them in spades. Crushed rock minerality and bright acidity make this gewürz one of the best and brightest I have ever tasted. It is a perfect wine to enjoy on its own or with something equally exotic like a Thai vegetarian green curry. A bientot! —Mulan Chan

Brighten Your January

Well, another year seems to have sneaked up on us. It is January, and the days are short, but getting longer. It's the quiet time after the holidays and a great time to get together with friends and share a meal. I have some suggestions for wines to brighten your days and one to sip with a winter meal on a rainy (or snowy) day.

One of our favorite and most consistent producers in Puligny Montrachet is **Domaine Paul Pernot**. The 2002s have just arrived and are delightful, reflecting the rich, opulent character of the vintage. The **2002 Bourgogne Blanc (\$16.99)** has delightful Puligny character, with ripe and luscious texture on the palate and a long finish. The **2002 Puligny-Montrachet (\$38.99)** has lots of energy and drive, and plenty of density. The 2002 Puligny-Montrachet, "Folatieres," 1er Cru (\$63.99) is rounder, fleshier and gentler than the Pucelles, and shows lots of power and length. The 2002 Puligny-Montrachet, "Pucelles," 1er Cru, (\$73.99) is full-bodied, concentrated, intense and classy. The 2002 Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet, Grand Cru (\$109.99) is Clive Coates pick of all the Pernots. He calls it "concentrated, very harmonious and very classy." As well as, "a very lovely, very intense wine." Finally, the 2002 Bâtard-Montrachet, Grand Cru (\$129.99) is concentrated, oily, rich and long.

For dinner with friends, on a cold night, let me recommend a wonderful Vosne-Romanée, the **1997 Domaine Anne-Francoise Gros Vosne-Romanée, "Aux Reas" (\$18.99).** Yes, that's right, less than \$20 for a mature, estate-bottled Vosne Romanée that is ready to drink. Clive Coates calls it "Rich, gently ripe and very elegant and long on the plate. This is very opulent and very seductive." Of course, quantities are limited, so don't delay. A santé!

Sotto la Pergola Inclinata

Every January when winter's cold sets in I begin to crave wines of power and ripeness that are full of complex character, something to reflect on over a warming, extended meal. At the start of a new year I also look back over the great wines I've tasted, and which ones I plan to drink again or cellar. This year's clear winner is the 1997 Livio Sassetti "Pertimali" Brunello di Montalcino Riserva (\$145.00).

I've always gotten a Rhône-like feeling from Pertimali that sets it apart from the rest of Montalcino. It is distinct, dramatically unique, and there is nothing simple about it. Riserva level Brunello is a different kind of wine, generally less effusive in its youth, brooding, with a seething cauldron of flavor underneath its potent structure. Pertimali's nose is full of ripe, chocolaty aromas, sweet plums, dates, dried figs, lavender, violets and raspberry preserves that slowly release from the glass, swirling into a cyclonic masterpiece. On the palate the fruit goes through a metamorphosis, and earthier, gamey, spicy aromas come forward like fresh-cut leather, Chinese five spice and braised meats followed by a chocolate redux of ripe fruit. Its tremendous power, a combination of structure, density and richness, rolls across your palate with a smooth, polished feeling. Tannins are substantial, rightfully so,

but sweet and in balance for a wine of this size, power, density and vintage.

This wine is expensive, but when you think that they produced only 3,000 bottles, it is a rare treat indeed. Its reviews were lackluster by '97s inflated standards (92 points from Robert Parker). To me, many other wine scores seemed to be eerily reminiscent of internet stock prices at the crescendo of the tech boom, inflated and not based on any kind of historical earnings. Livio Sassetti's Pertimali is one of the most famous and oldest producers of Brunello di Montalcino. Parker writes: "I am beginning to think that if I had only one Brunello di Montalcino to drink, it would have to be Pertimali."

I like to open my bottle 4-6 hours ahead of time and pour it into a decanter to allow this wine to unleash its power. This is not a pizza or pasta wine. This wine is about foods with a flavor of the earth like slow braised meats, pot roast, osso buco and porcini mushrooms. Start your new year out right, experience Livio Sassetti's Pertimali Riserva, or try his full flavored **2001 Rosso di Montalcino (\$23.99)** or the truly dynamic **1998 Brunello di Montalcino (\$42.99)**, both full of Pertimali's pedigree and terroir. And enjoy.

2002 Pala Cannonau "Triente" from Sardegna (\$13.99) Do you love Côtes du Rhône and Châteauneuf-du-Pape? Well, get prepared to like the red wines of Sardinia, especially Cannonau. This is the same grape as the French grenache and the Spanish garnacha. Bright scarlet in color, with forward, ripe fruity aromas layered by a touch of smoke. Raspberry fruit and tart cranberries mingle with soft earthy components. This is a fresh, racy wine for simple foods with strong flavors.

2001 Ca'Viola Langhe Dolcetto "Barturot" (\$25.99) Three Glasses went to this lovely wine in Gambero Rosso! This is actually a Dolcetto d'Alba denied DOC status this year by a technicality concerning the relocation of the winery. This dark ruby red monster has aromas of ripe raspberries and cherry. The palate is a work of art. Full and forceful, it unveils lingering sweet fruit tones that exalt the finish, which is lifted by soft tannins.

The 2000 Castello di Lucignano Chianti Classico Riserva (\$27.99)

has great balance, gorgeous fruit, plenty of leather and sweet cherry characteristics along with nuances of tobacco and smoke. This wine will easily age over the next decade but can be approached sooner then later if decanted a couple hours before serving (try it with a roasted pork loin!). Salute!

Jeff's Picks: 2nd Coming of Theise

On Saturday, January 17, we are proud to host for the second year running Terry Theise and his gang from Champagne, Austria and, of course, Germany. Terry has been instrumental in introducing the U.S. to the wonders of grower-producer Champagne, and artisan wines from Austria and Germany. He is a passionate champion of these regions, and it shines through in his writing and his work. At our tasting in Redwood City you will have a chance not only to speak with Terry but also with the growers themselves. At least nine growers/representatives will be on hand to pour wine and chat, including (from Germany), the lovable Johannes Leitz, the handsome and charming Andreas Spreitzer, Mister Mosel Johannes Selbach, and others. So don't miss it. For those of you who can't hop a plane and be with us, I feature below the wines of a few growers you won't want to miss.

2002 in the Mosel is a vintage where site and fruit shine through with astonishing clarity and polish. None make me happier than those from brothers Rolf and Alfred Merkelbach. The **2002 Merkelbach Kinheimer Rosenberg Kabinett (\$13.99)** is a steal. This wine is so damned pretty you want to hug the bottle. Sleek and racy, not the biggest dog on the block, but with gorgeous green apple, keen spicy slate, a real Kabinett, viral and lithe, like the sun captured in a bottle.

The **2002 Merkelbach Ürziger Würzgarten Auslese #15 (\$22.99)** was one of my personal favorites during my trip to Germany in May. I tasted this at the Selbach's and made a ridiculous mess of my notebook with all kinds of stars and happy faces. This Auslese is charged with life, full of wild strawberry fruit, slate and spice, firm and very long on the palate with superbly balanced sweetness and acidity. Please enjoy and check the website for more details about the tasting. Happy to be back here again. Your back page man.
