2001 Léoville-Las-Cases Debuts

Jean Hubert Delon has finally released his excellent 2001s, and they are selling quickly. They will arrive end of April or beginning of May.

2001 Château Léoville-Las-Cases, St-Julien\$79.99

Clyde would much rather have three bottles of the 2001 than one of the 2000. 1/3 the price of the 2000. 92-94 points Robert Parker: "A wine of great intensity and purity (what's new?), this blend of 69% Cabernet Sauvignon, 19.5% Merlot, and 11.5% Cabernet Franc boasts a thick purple color in addition to an extraordinary classic Las Cases bouquet of graphite, licorice, and sweet black cherries intermixed with currant and a hint of vanilla. The 2001 is a bit firmer, with higher acidity analytically than the 2000, and the tannin seemingly more in evidence. Nevertheless, this is a relatively large-scaled, dense, backward, concentrated offering...one of the candidates for wine of the vintage."

2000 KJ Great Estates Santa Barbara Chardonnay.....**\$14.99** 90 points from Robert Parker: "The 2000 Great Estates Chardonnay Santa Barbara (4,222 cases), is an example of California Chardonnay at its finest. The wine boasts loads of tropical fruits, medium to full body, and a flamboyant, spicy personality. It should last for 2-3 years, perhaps longer. This is an excellent value considering its high quality. Estimated cost \$28."

- **1999 Panther Creek "Shea Vineyard" Willamette Valley Pinot Noir\$21.99** 90 points from the *Wine Spectator* and listed with a suggested retail price of \$49 in the May 31, 2002 issue! This Pinot Noir is full and muscular with excellent fruit, spice and balance.
- **2000 Mount Eden Santa Cruz Mountains Cabernet.......\$27.99** It's loaded with everything you could want from a cab and the price has stayed well on the reasonable side. Deep, dark, rich and supple, drink some now and put a few down for 5 years. You'll have an extraordinary cabernet in a value price range.
- **2000 Mount Eden Estate Chardonnay**\$32.99 94 points from Parker. This is a balanced yet big, rich, lush and creamy powerhouse of a wine hinting at the French style more than just a little. This baby could use a few years. FYI: Don't miss our Mount Eden dinner in April with Jeffrey Patterson!
- **2000 Joseph Phelps "Insignia"**......**\$79.99** The 2000 is showing very well right now! It has up-front fruit, a velvety texture and a long spicy finish. It is a nice change from the 1997, which is almost portlike! (Trey Beffa) Parker gave it 91 points!
- **2001 Lewis Cellars Reserve Napa Cabernet Sauvignon****\$84.99** 1,400 cases produced. This is the showcase wine for Lewis Cellars and perhaps their best to date. *Wine Spectator* gave it 95-100 points from the barrel. Made from 94% cabernet sauvignon and 6% cabernet franc, this is a bright wine with deep, dark black fruit, chocolate and hints of oak throughout. Beautifully structured with good acidity, a long-term cellar candidate.

California Cabernet Futures

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My Money is Going Toward 2001 Bordeaux

We have always loved this vintage, from the first sip of the first wine back in March 2002. We have preached its merits: early accessibility, very low prices compared to the hyped 2000s, etc. It was like swimming upstream as all of the wine writers kept extolling the virtues of 2000 Bordeaux. We did sell quite a bit of 2001 on futures to our savvy customers who are always looking for value. We have been back to Bordeaux twice in 2003 to retaste the wines. We have done four dinners featuring this underrated vintage. And in January we attended the UGC tasting of the same wines. The final conclusion: We were spot-on, and the 2001 Bordeaux wines are delicious! Just ask the 500 people who attended the dinners. We heard them say they thought the 2001s showed exceptionally well. Now the wines are arriving, and we believe they will sell very well.

To put the value aspect into perspective, Château Léoville-Las-Cases just released their 2001. In January we sold 50 cases of 2000 Léoville-Las-Cases at \$239.99 per bottle! It is an excellent wine deserving its 98 or so points (I even bought two bottles). Now we offer the 2001 Léoville-Las-Cases at under \$80! It only received 92-94 points, but if my math is correct you can get three bottles (276-282 points worth) of 2001 for one bottle of 2000. I can hear Robert Parker's words now: "... smart money should be chasing the better 2001s." Well I will certainly chase these wines. I will be able to enjoy them before I am 90 years old and I won't have to will them to my grandchildren. My advice? Give this vintage a consideration. Many have increased in price since our first offerings, but they still represent VALUE, and that is what the wine business is all about. Check this page and page 5 for 2001s. You won't be disappointed and you will thank K&L for the advice. —*Clyde Beffa, Jr*

Jeff's Picks

The Rheinhessen has suffered a bad reputation for all but the most dedicated fans of German Riesling, and I must say it is not unfounded. The region's sea of vineyards on mostly flat uninspired terrain produces an equally large ocean of uninspired wines. The flat undulating hills from Mainz west to the Nahe, and from the left bank of the Rheingau south to Worms have little to do with the stunning and ethereal wines produced in Nierstein, Bingen and Nackenheim, some of the steepest and best sites on the Rhine. Traveling south from Mainz you reach the first collection of great vineyards in Nackenheim, the home of the Rothenberg, Gunderloch's super steep, red-soiled vineyard. The Gunderloch estate is without question the shining star of the region, and in the past ten years they have risen to new heights. The 2002 vintage produced amazing results. One might even say they surpassed the 2001 wines in sheer beauty. We have a complete collection available, some in limited quantities. Don't miss out.

The 2002 Nackenheimer Rothenberg Spätlese (\$25.99) was awarded Spätlese of the Year by the Gault Millau, Germany's most important wine publication, and 93 points from the Wine Spectator. It is a wine of the vineyard, with peppery notes to the nose and the palate, rich aromas of acacia blossom, honey and tangerine, and a core of crackling limey acidity to hold the lush palate together and draw the wine out. A long, involved wine that is concentrated and deep. The 2002 Nackenheimer Rothenberg Auslese (\$34.99), which received 94 points from Wine Spectator, could be the greatest Auslese at Gunderloch to date. It leaves you breathless with a detailed nose of honey, wax, ripe peaches, white figs, a wash of wet stone and red earth, humming and glowing under a blanket of apricots sprinkled with cinnamon spice and chopped dates. What makes it great, truly great, is its precision and purity, its expressiveness of place and clear bright fruit. The 2002 Nackenheimer Rothenberg Gold Capsule Auslese (375ml \$32.99, 750ml \$62.99) is a botrytis selection and one that I look forward to each year. Never over blown or cloying, always bright and rich and still full of the vineyard character that I love. I need that red slate! The 2002 is alive with spice from the soil and the clean botrytis-affected fruit that heaps layers of rich honeyed, pineapple goodness upon the palate. Candied orange peal and hints of fresh raspberry linger in the glass along with cinnamon and date. We also have small quantities of the TBA (98 points Spectator) and BA (95 points Spectator). 2001 Bordeaux: Stunning in the Right and Left Banks

At our recent dinner/tasting at Cetrella restaurant in Half Moon Bay with **Ch. Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande** from the left bank commune of Pauillac and **Ch. Angelus** from the right bank commune of St-Emilion, the wines spoke in volumes of the outstanding quality of 2001 from both banks of the Gironde estuary. No one has made better or as wildly commercially successful wine in the last 10 years in St-Emilion than Angélus. The main reason for this success is Hubert de Bouard, the eighth-generation owner and winemaker. This is much rarer than you might think in this age of high paid consultants and vineyard management teams. My notes on the 2001 are spectacular. Just as impressive and much more affordable is his vineyard in the commune of Lalande-de-Pomerol, **Ch. La Fleur Bouard**. While it doesn't possess the finely tuned aspect of Angélus, this ultra-ripe merlot is luscious with deeply rooted blackberry flavors and plenty of glossy oak that appeals to even the most devoted California style palate.

After the opulence of Angélus even the #1 selling Bordeaux in K&L history was in tough company. Gildas d'Ollone the director of Ch. Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande, poured his elegant stable of wines from 2001. The cabernet sauvignon is the difference between these two great estates, and the freshness, acidity and structure shines in the wines. The second wine of Pichon, **Reserve de la Comtesse**, was a lively mid-weight wine with spicy red berry fruit. Pichon itself is deeper, rounder, with mouth-coating mulberry flavors. I would advise to hold off for the perfection this wine will bring with 5-7-10 years of time in the cellar. I tasted the '89, '85, and '86, and wine just does not get much better these. The '86 still needs time!

Another wine of note this month is the **2001 Ch. Rouget (\$31.99)** from Pomerol. This old estate, established in 1750, is a pure expression of beautiful merlot in a lively, crisp, red fruit style. **2001 Pagodes de Cos (\$24.99)**, the 2nd wine of the great 2nd growth Cos d'Estournel, is the wine you buy first and taste ASAP as it is once again one of the great deals in all of wine. A regal wine of deep, spicy black fruit and earth. Both wines will be added to my collection.

Jim C's View Down Under

Australia continues to be a leader in producing wines that are fruit driven and deliver a lot of bang for the buck. Here we have three new arrivals that represent different areas showing distinct regional character, not easy to do at this price point!

2001 Wynns Coonawarra Shiraz South Australia (\$9.99) Grown on the famed terra rossa soils in Coonawarra, the Wynns shows the classic elegant style produced here. The bouquet is perfumed, with notes of red current, cherry and cedar. On the palate there are notes of red licorice, mocha, pepper and a hint of bay leaf. The dusty fine tannins and balancing acidity lead to a long finish with a hint of mint. There is real sense of Coonawarra here.

2002 Fifth Leg Margaret River Western Australia (\$9.99) This wine is produced and bottled by the folks at Devil's Lair and made up of 36% cabernet sauvignon, 31% merlot, 29% shiraz and 4% cabernet franc. Once again, the elegance of Margaret River and this blend of grapes show a graceful balanced wine that is hard to resist. Beautiful aromatics of smoky plum, current and violets that leap from the glass are replicated on the palate with a note of sage. Soft, plush tannins support the juicy ripe middle fruit that goes on and on.

2002 Piping Shrike Barossa Valley Shiraz (\$12.99) Piping Shrike is another name for the Australian Magpie that protects the vineyards from thieving blackbirds. Well, thank God for those little birdies, because this is rich Barossa Shiraz for a song. Packed with ripe dark raspberry and blackberry fruit and spice, the wine shows true varietal character. It's a jammy, juicy Shiraz with creamy oak and fine tannins leading to a long sweet finish.

2002 Goat-Roti Western Cape South Africa (\$15.99) This wine is made by the Fairview winery in South Africa, and is the "big brother" to the Goats do Roam, which is one of the biggest selling South African wines in the U.S. As the Goats do Roam is a southern Rhône style wine, the Goat-Roti is a nod to the northern Rhône. The wine is bursting with blackberry, current and plum fruit accented by notes of tar and bittersweet chocolate. All of these elements are nicely integrated with the fine ripe tannins giving good structure. Made from 95% syrah, and as in Cote-Rotie, 5% viognier giving the wine a fine aromatic lift. The *Wine Spectator* rated it 91 points. Don't miss it! Cheers! —*Jim Chanteloup*

Trey's Corner: Phelps Dinner in SF

In January I was fortunate enough to attend a Joseph Phelps dinner held in San Francisco at Rubicon. For the first course we were served the **2001 Ovation Chardonnay** and the **1997 Ovation Chardonnay**. It was interesting tasting the two side by side. The 2001 shows flavors of melons, pears, creamy fruits and toasty oak. The 1997 was much more golden in color and began to take on a sweeter and more honeyed characteristic.

The reds were served with two courses. The first flight was the **2000 Insignia**, **1997 Insignia** and the **1995 Insignia**. I'd bet you won't believe me if you weren't there, but the wine that showed the best in this flight was the 2000. It was delicious! Upfront fruit, spicy oak and red currant fruits, the 2000 was more balanced and restrained than the 1997, which was almost port like. The 1995 showed well but seemed to be less interesting than the first two. The 2000 also tasted the best with the food, which was a squab with foie gras and wild mushrooms.

The second flight consisted of the **1990 Insignia**, **1985 Insignia** and **1978 Insignia** served with a lamb loin and glazed lamb ribs with mustard and walnut vinaigrette. The '85 and '78 were very exciting and probably the most interesting wines of the night. Both show that classic older California Cabernet qualities of mint, sage, tobacco and eucalyptus. The 1990 was a bit disappointing and quite a bit leaner than I expected, although it did show some pleasant flavors. The overall experience was excellent and it was nice to be able to taste the evolution of a California wine that dates back to 1974.

History in a bottle

Jeffrey Patterson of **Mount Eden Vineyards** uses the Santa Cruz Mountains winery and vineyards throughout the state to craft wines showing a deft balance between a French and Californian style. Preceding Patterson in winemaking at Mount Eden are Martin Ray, Richard Graff, Peter Graff, Mary Edwards, Bill Anderson and Fred Peterson, leading back to the end of prohibition—quite a heritage! These wines are true descendants of the greats, and any serious wine buff is remiss in not making it a priority to try them.

Patterson crafts a range of wines, starting with the value-priced 2002 West Slope Chardonnay (\$9.99) and the 2001 Mount Eden Mac-Gregor Chardonnay (\$14.99) from Edna Valley. This pair of beauties gets raves from staff and customers alike. Either the round tropical fruit and sweet toasty oak of the West Slope, or the rich balance and crisp acidity of the MacGregor are sure to win your heart. The 2000 Mount Eden Estate Chardonnay (\$32.99) got 94 points from Robert Parker and is a balanced yet rich, minerally lush, creamy powerhouse of a wine hinting at the French style more than just a little. This baby could use a few years. On the red side, the 2000 Mount Eden Santa Cruz Mountains Cabernet Sauvignon (\$27.99) that I told you about last month is a true no brainer. It's loaded with everything you could want from a cab, and the price has stayed well on the reasonable side. Deep, dark, rich and supple, drink some now and put a few down for five years. You'll have an extraordinary cab in a value-price range. Lamentably, the last vintage of this next wine is upon us. But luckily, the 2000 Mount Eden Old Vine Reserve Cabernet (\$49.99) will give us years of enjoyment. It has finesse and power, complexity and structure. You have to try this one to believe it. Enjoy!

See you in the city...

Lewis Cellars is a small family winery established in 1992. The total production is approximately 8,500 cases. All the wines are unfiltered and unfined. From the beginning, Lewis wines have been highly thought of by consumers and press alike. Give yourself a treat!

2002 Barcaglia Lane Russian River Chardonnay (\$49.99) A beautiful well-integrated chardonnay with ripe fruit and a Meursault-like minerality. The wine shows beautifully now but can age for 2-4 years. The grapes come from a small vineyard in the Russian River Valley developed for the Lewis's by the Dutton Family. Only Kistler and Lewis make a chardonnay from this vineyard.

2002 Reserve Napa Chardonnay (\$49.99) 400 cases produced. This is richer and creamier than the Barcaglia Lane. The Reserve is selected from the best lots that Lewis produces. Hints of pear and hazelnut with a long balanced finish. Eleven months in barrel, 70% new.

2002 Napa Pinot Noir (\$42.99) 200 cases produced. A very quiet wine showing ripe black fruit with a mid palate of mineral and earth. The fruit comes from the Oakville Grade in the Napa Valley.

2001 Reserve Cabernet (\$84.99) This is the showcase wine for Lewis Cellars. *Wine Spectator* gave it 95-100 points. This 94% cabernet, 6% cabernet franc blend is a bright wine with deep, dark black fruit, chocolate and hints of oak throughout. A cellar candidate.

Jeff's Loire Picks: Domaine du Clos Naudin

This estate is generally considered to be the penultimate in Vouvray and I whole-heartedly agree. This estate was founded in 1923 and is now in its third generation of Foreau control with Philippe at the helm. The vineyard holdings consist of 111/2 hectares of Chenin Blanc in the northeast corner of Vouvray with great exposure mid way up the hill and an average vine age of 35 years. The vineyards are tended pursuant to organic methods and worked with organic fertilizers. Harvest is done manually with numerous passes through the vineyards to select ripe grapes bunch by bunch. The grapes are pressed as gently as possible with a pneumatic press and the juice is left to ferment very slowly in the frigid cellar. There is never any malolactic, and the wines have not been chaptalized since 1983 when Philippe took over. The 2000 Philippe Foreau Vouvray Sec (\$19.99) I mentioned before is like walking a garden path in late spring with the aromas of fresh flowers in the breeze, honeysuckle wafting through the crisp cool air. This is a light bodied, slightly austere wine, with a brilliant mineral core that leaps and dances yet never really lets you fully grasp it. Only time will tell. We also have two exciting sparkling wines from Foreau; the NV Vouvray Brut (\$17.99), a cuvee from 1999 disgorged in 2003, and the 1995 Brut Reserve (\$29.99). Both are made in the traditional "champagne" method and exhibit all the class and finesse you would expect from a Foreau wine. The NV is very dry, think extra brut, and is full of fresh green apple aromas and hints of hazelnuts. The Brut Reserve 1995 is the powerhouse of the two, with an extraordinary panoply of fresh fruits, flowers and earth in the nose and a rich yet dry palate. You owe it to yourself to try these wines. —Jeff Vierra

1999 Marques de Riscal Rioja Reserva (\$9.99) Normally priced in the \$15-\$20 range, this classic Rioja is one of my top picks for red wine bargains in the store! From the aromas of anise and vanilla to the black cherry and currant fruit on the palate, the Riscal exudes class and style. So smooth and luscious, you can drink this now. But this Rioja can age beautifully in your cellar for the next 3-5 years.

2001 A. Palacios, Les Terrasses, Priorat (\$22.99) 90 points from Stephen Tanzer! He says: "...made from estate grapes that did not make it into Alvaro Palacios' L'Ermita or Finca Dofi, plus purchased garnacha and cariñena) Red-ruby. Black fruits, licorice and tarry oak on the nose. Dense, sweet and full, with wild, super-ripe fruit flavors. Has a distinctly warm aspect but this harmonious blend also boasts plenty of character."

2001 Val Sacro Dioro Rioja (\$31.99) 2001 is a blockbuster for the Rioja area and this red from Rioja shows off all of that great style and depth. Made from a single vineyard, the Dioro is a great example of the "New World Style" of Rioja. It's big and flashy and fruit driven. From the ripe currant and blackberry fruit to the oak and spice aromas, it's a great Spanish red to try for all of you dyed-in-the-wool Cali wine lovers! Buen Cata! —*Anne Pickett*

The Condes Report: A Rhône Adventure

Just imagine it is a warm summer's eve, as we drift along the banks of Avignon on the Rhône River. The warm drops of sunlight soothe our skin as the fresh lavender-scented breeze refreshes us. We sit at the table and are presented with a plate of stuffed peppers served over roasted aubergines. A 2001 Domaine de la Pinede Châteauneuf-du-Pape (\$22.99) is offered and is pleasantly charming with aromas of exotic spice, raspberries and a texture as soft as the dish's own. The sommelier informs us that the growers of this region must discard a minimum of 5% of the harvest in order to boost the percentage of good grapes used. The main course arrives, roast rack of lamb with a cumin-salt garnish over a timbale of baby Chinese eggplant flavored with star anise. Our sommelier kindly recommends a 2001 Jean Royer Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Hommage a Mon Pére (\$85) and offers us a taste for approval. We are immediately pleased with flavors of gingerbread, licorice, roasted nuts and plums. The wine progressively ascends into a rich, lush texture with a complexity and structure to last 20 years, or to finish tonight. As the sun sets over the horizon, we are reminded of what an outstanding vintage 2001 has been in the south and what a classic year it was for the north. We finish the evening with a cheese plate featuring Saint Marcellin with a blueberry compote. To commemorate our trip to the north we open a 2000 Delas Les Launes Crozes-Hermitage (Inquire), which shows an aroma of violets, cassis and white pepper. The finish is long and delicious with a hint of cocoa to keep you coming back for more. These wines are easy to understand and are perfect pairings for today's boldly flavored cuisine. -Gregory Condes

Monsters in March

No, it is not quite Halloween. But, we do have some monster Rhône reds to start spring off right. One is a monster value of extremely good quality and the other two are huge, monstrously concentrated wines worthy of any cellar.

2001 Domaine Croix de Rascas, Languedoc (\$9.99) A nice, balanced little red made of 70% grenache and 30% syrah. Supple, with raspberry and Bing cherry fruit. It has notes of vanilla, spices and oak. This is a wine that will work with roasted chicken, eggplant, lighter beef dishes and everything in between!

2001 Domaine Grand Veneur Châteauneuf-du-Pape, "Les Origines" (\$34.99) A dark garnet and purple color tempts the eye while luscious aromas of black fruits, cocoa, coffee and a touch of anise seduce the nose. In the mouth, dark black cherries and rich blackberry fruit excite the tongue with a balancing touch of white pepper. Drink now or age for the next 5-6 years. Will work best with hearty foods like beef and pork.

2001 Domaine la Soumade Rasteau "Fleur de Confiance" (\$54.99) is the most monstrous of the three. As you have probably noticed before, I am crazy about wines from this estate. The "Fleur de Confiance" is 100% old-vine grenache and a real cellar candidate. Huge, with new toasty oak and raspberry scents, tart cherry fruit in the mouth with accompanying boysenberries and red currants and a lingering finish of generous spices. This one will age extremely well for the next 10+ years. Patience will reap rewards with this wine. If you plan to drink it early, decant or double decant. A real "must buy" for collectors!

La Nouvelle Vague: French Regional Wines

The French farmers were at it again. It was the summer of 1992. Having just graduated from college, I was spending a month in Paris. The plan was to travel, visit family and experience first-hand all things French that until now I had only understood through books or film. There was so much to see and do, I didn't know how I was going to fit it all in. And then came the phone call from aunt Edwige. The French farmers were striking, and in a most dramatic fashion, had taken to burning tires on various key national roadways. Interstate travel had come to a virtual standstill, and as a result, thousands of French had taken to the trains. Now my six-hour train ride from Paris to Nice had turned into a thirteen-hour circuitous nightmare. Somewhere between hour 7-8 of my hot and sticky ride, I passed out. When I finally awoke and looked out my window, I was awestruck. The rugged mountain range before me was an amazing hue of gold and rust. Slowly, solid rock gave way to a wild and untamed underbrush, and everywhere the air smelled of roasted herbs. I rubbed my eyes. The light down here seemed different too, lighter and brighter. I had just discovered Provence, and what an amazing first impression! I finally did make it down to Nice, and as a welcome my uncle prepared the most Provencal of meals: Leg of lamb (Gigot d'agneau) with a fennel and flageolet bean salad. It was delicious, and for me the beginning of a love affair with the region. Since that summer I have returned several times and am always very sad to leave this beautiful place. One sure-fire cure for the post-Provence blues is to have a few friends over, open a few bottles of wine and prepare some favorite Provencal dishes. Brandade, one of my all-time favorites, is a

mixture of dried salt cod, potato, and garlic. Best served with garlic croutons and a glass of the 2002 Ch. La Canorgue Côtes du Luberon Blanc (\$10.99). Comprised of grenache blanc and ugni blanc, it is crisp, polished and an absolute natural with this dish. The 2001 Domaine la Soumade Cabernet Sauvignon (\$11.99) is a rich and powerful wine that still manages to maintain a certain refinement. Ripe fruit, soft tannins and a lingering finish make this southern Rhône wine a superb value. Perfect any night of the week with a fennel roasted pork loin or rosemary roast chicken. A perfect complement to Gigot d'Agneau is the 1999 Domaines Bunan Moulin des Costes Bandol Rouge (\$20.99). Made predominantly from the mourvèdre grape, Bandol is often considered the traditional king of Provencal reds. This one also exhibits the hedonistic fruit of grenache with the aromatics of cinsault. Laurent Bunan blends in about 5% syrah, which he maintains adds an extra dimension of color and fruit, much like pepper on a steak. This is a big wine, full of chewy plum, earth, licorice and blackcurrant. And finally, the 2000 Domaine de Trevallon Rouge (\$37.95) is a perfect complement to Boeuf a la Nicoise (beef stew simmered in tomatoes, wine and spices). This unconventional blend of syrah and cabernet hails from one of the finest estates in Provence. The 2000 is considered one of the greatest Trevallon wines to date, with chocolate covered cherries, roasted herbs and black licorice. This is a wine of truly great power, structure and length. Cellar this for five to eight years, or decant vigorously. Bon Appetit!

This store is funky in more ways than one: Our side building was a nightclub in decades past; our holding area for customers A through L used to be the stage. Sly Stone got his start on that very stage, and our very own Don Davis used to live upstairs. We have interesting departments as well, such as: Peavey bass cabinet storage (Gary Westby's Sherry back stock), wine vinegar storage barrels (Jim Barr), guitar, lava lamp and dog (Old and Rare), Yellow Submarine mural (at the in-store phone station, regarding which overhead paging such as "please call me at the Yellow Sub" can often be heard), Sports Memorabilia station (Bordeaux Specialist Ralph), tomato juice back stock (Mary), 51 airplane bottles (I counted) and 37 bottles of assorted scotch, vodka and sundries (Susan), and my favorite: the rear restroom dubbed the Pink Room (Kerri Beffa painted it, I had nothing to do with it).

We've just received small batches of 1**988 and 1993 Léoville-Las-Cases**, an absolute top notch St-Julien. The '88 vintage is quite diverse, with wine styles ranging from angular to elegant to tannic. Fearing

Jim's March Gems

March is one of my favorite times of the year at my vineyard in the Anderson Valley. The hills are a lush green intermingled with waves of lupin, iris, clover and other wildflowers. Bud break in the vineyards is about to take place, and a new adventure is about to unfold. It is, in short, an exciting time to behold.

I have four very special gems that you need to try and then buy in mass quantities for your everyday enjoyment. When Clyde purchased the **2002 Château Roquefort Bordeaux Blanc (\$9.99)** last year, he made the decision to hold it back at one of our warehouses in Bordeaux to give it time to come together. He felt that this annual Jim's Gem wasn't showing as well at that time. What a difference a year makes; this wine just shines! Made from sauvignon blanc (60%), sémillon (30%), and muscadelle (10%), this wine offers bright ripe grapefruit to lime aromas and in the mouth just a hint of wet grass and minerals. It finishes with a brisk, clean, crisp, mouthwatering quality that will make you go back for yet another glass. Ebby says you need cases of this lovely wine. (

Some of the greatest Bordeaux buys in this market are the "seconds" coming from many of the major Bordeaux houses. These are generally made up of wine from younger, newly planted sections of an estate vineyard. (If you want a thorough, two-hour dissertation on this aspect, give Ralph a call at extension 623.) The **1997 Les Fiefs de Lagrange, St-Julien (\$12.99)**, the second wine of Château Lagrange, is a wonderful example of the high quality level these wines can achieve. An expansive bouquet of black currants, cassis and cedar leads to a round, soft, complex wine with tons of structure and character on the palate. And in this case you have the best of both worlds—a wonderful second from a great château in a wonderfully drinking vintage at a

rain, and with the '87 weather problems still fresh in their minds, some producers pulled out the shears too early. These wines suffered from under ripe cabernet sauvignon and developed a pinched, green quality and lack of depth. Not so at Las-Cases. Their '88 showcases the best qualities of the vintage—superb concentration and complex flavors, firm structure (but that is Las-Cases in any vintage), heady, ripe fruit and cedar notes on the nose. We are at the peak of drinkability right this moment with a large window in which to cellar the wine. The 1993 Las-Cases: again, a problem vintage with rollercoaster weather and a record-breaking opening of the heavens in September. This time all of the producers were in the same boat (or ark, more likely) and rode out the vintage in a somewhat similar fashion. There was not the guesswork of when to pick, just a mad rush to do so when the rains fell. But Las-Cases, with its intensely severe selection process, once again trumped the weather and made one of the top wines of the vintage.

Jim Barr, Technical Genius.

Jim spends a lot of time with his customers...particularly when he is manning the cash register. By pushing one button per minute, he is able to REALLY get to know the many moods of the person he is, ah, helping. Jim has been responsible for many changes at K&L: longer store hours (to finish up those pesky multiple bottle ring ups); increased staffing (can you get someone ELSE to help me? PLEASE?!), and increased customer service ("May we fix you some lunch while Jim finishes up your order? And how was the breakfast?") The name Jim Barr has become synonymous with service, feel free to choose what kind. The King of the cash register...Jim Barr, technical genius! —Joe Zugelder

As you read this, I am ready to depart for France to taste the 2002s and do an in-depth evaluation of the vintage. However, I have some 2002 and 2001 white Burgundies that are here now and ready for your Spring drinking (or cellaring, in some cases).

1998 Moulin-a-Vent, Domaine Romanesca\$13.99

The **2002 Pouilly-Fuissé, Vielles Vignes, Domaine Delorme** (\$19.99) is classic. From the slopes of Vergisson, below the basalt monolith on steep, well-drained soil, this has minerality, brightness and length. It reminds you what Pouilly-Fuissé once was, and should be—bright, engaging, rich, barrel fermented and lovely.

The winemaker at **Domaine Leflaive**, Pierre Morey, also has his own domaine, with the same commitment to quality and biodynamic grape growing. His style is more restrained however and less overtly oaky. The **2001 Bourgogne Chardonnay** (**\$19.99**) is a perfect argument for why this appellation needs to be taken much more seriously. It's rich and full-bodied, with elegant fruit and length. The **2001 Meursault** (**\$49.99**) is bigger than the Bourgogne, and carries laser-like precision. Amazingly focused! The **2001 Meursault "Tessons"** (**\$56.99**) has great minerality, offset by notes of ripe fruit and a buttery quality. Again, it is a focused, intellectually fascinating wine. His **2001 Meursault, "Perrieres," 1er Cru** (**\$82.99**) is a Key Buy from Burghound, who writes: "…flavors were stunningly pure and precise, oozing minerality and finishing with superb persistence." A Santé. —*Keith Wollenberg*

Sotto la Pergola Inclinata

The last two decades for the Italian wine world have been nothing short of astounding. Long known as a producer of prodigious quantities of quaffable, quaintly packaged and generally cheap wine, Italy began to change those concepts in the 1970's predominantly in Tuscany. Piero Antinori with the release of Tignanello broke the mold and the damn burst with a wave of experimentation centered mostly in Chianti, that storied land between Florence and Siena. From early experiments in Chianti many others too numerous to name took up the quality banner and moved Italy forward into a new era that spread all across the land.

Unfortunately for Chianti Classico much of the revolutionary work and spectacular growth continued outside of its borders. Bogged down by D.O.C. regulations, political infighting, poor clonal selection and worldwide preconceived notions about this best known of all Italian wines, Chianti moved forward at a snail's pace. A scant 20 years ago these wines were allowed to have 30% white grapes!

Chianti Classico also has to struggle with the burden of several other "Chianti Zones" whose regulations are decidedly less stringent. These knockoffs continue to fill up grocery stores and pizza parlors with cheap wines labeled "Chianti," many of whose origins are decidedly

Most producers make a Normale, Cru (vineyard designated) and Riserva, followed by a proprietarily named wine that is loosely categorized as a Super Tuscan (unfortunately this term has no definition and applies to a myriad of wines across Tuscany). Chianti Classico's highest quality products fall into the Super Tuscan category, and those who drink them generally have no idea that these wines could be classified as Chianti Classico now under the existing D.O.C. laws. Today even Tignanello could be Chianti Classico! In the coming months as Chianti Classico's presence in our Italian selection grows, take advantage of the superb 1999, 2000 and 2001 vintages that offer a great selection of styles, price points and levels of concentration for drinking now or over the next decade.

The 2002 Ermacora Sauvignon (\$10.99) is classic sauvignon blanc. This wine has a fresh grassiness to it, with completely ripe grapes adding to the texture. It is rich and aromatic with a touch of minerals on the finish and would pair well with spicy vegetable-rice dishes.

2002 Virna Dolcetto d'Alba (\$11.99) This wine has a elegant bouquet of ripe cherries and blackberries. The juice goes from stainless steel tanks straight to bottle. On the palate, the wine produces dark fruit with floral and chocolate tones. This wine will work well with risottos and pastas with meat or mushrooms sauces.

2000 Apollonio Copertino (\$7.99) Marked down from \$9.99! A wonderful surprise from Puglia! Made from all sorts of grapes one doesn't find on our shores including negro amaro (80%), Leece malvasia nera, montepulciano, Brindisi malvasia nera and good old sangiovese. Quite impressive and insanely priced. Stock up!!!

2001 Blason Cabernet "Comugna" (\$9.99) This is a very expressive wine that has loads of ripe cherry, anise and some woodsy aromatics. Medium to full-bodied, I get black currant and cassis on the palate with a very subtle and soft easy finish. A very user-friendly wine and easy on the wallet. Salute! —*Mike Parres*
