Delicious Wines From Bordeaux

Here are a few of our favorite wines to enjoy now and over the next few years.

BOTTLE

- **1993 Château Léoville-Las-Cases, St-Julien**.....**\$62.99** 90 points Parker: "Readers who find it difficult to believe that the 1993 vintage could turn out wines such as this only need to pull the cork on a bottle of the 1993 Léoville-Las-Cases."
- **1993 Château Léoville-Barton, St-Julien****\$39.99** Aromas of cigar box, soft currants and spice occupy the nose. On the palate it is medium bodied, round textured and very balanced. The wine is meant to be consumed in the near term (now-2 years), and would pair very well with grilled meats.

1994 Château Pichon-Lalande, Pauillac\$62.99 91-93 points Robert Parker: "Pichon-Lalande's 1994 should not be forgotten in the rush to buy the sumptuous, superstar 1995."

1997 Château Pichon-Lalande, Pauillac\$39.99 Parker: "This hedonistic, luscious, sexy, opulently-textured Pichon-Lalande is open-knit, with plentiful quantities of roasted herbs, smoky oak, vanillin, and creamy black currant fruit."

1997 Château Poujeaux, Haut-Médoc......\$23.99 Parker: "Undoubtedly a sleeper of the vintage, and probably the finest 1997 cru bourgeois ..." Clyde drinks a case a month of this beauty.

1998 Réserve de Comtesse Lalande, Pauillac.....**\$22.99** The second wine of Pichon-Lalande is a fantastic bargain. What a delightful surprise. Super merlot-dominated nose (black fruits). Also lots of cedar/oak aromas that follow to the palate. Power and elegance combined.

2001 Pagodes de Cos, St-Estèphe\$24.99 Don't miss this beauty. Fabulous quality. This wine is so silky it tastes great right now, but will cellar well for five plus years.

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2003 Bordeaux: Iron Fist in a Velvet Glove

The K&L "Bordeaux Contingent" has returned after tasting some 700 or so wines, mostly from the 2003 vintage. All in all, the trip went quite smoothly with none of us taking ill or "hitting the wall." Winewise, the vintage was not terribly difficult to taste, even though the wines were high in tannins and in alcohol. Thankfully there was enough fruit to mask some of the tannins and the acids were on the low side. Also, we took two extra days in Bordeaux this year to space out our tastings.

And the vintage you ask? Well, check out Ralph's column on page 9 and be sure to get our 16-page Vintage Report. It was available as of April 15. All I can say is that there are some fabulous wines from the torridly hot vintage of 2003. Unlike 2000, when almost all properties produced good quality wines, 2003 saw much more variability. There were outstanding wines made from all regions of Bordeaux, but there were also poor wines made from all regions. In general the wines from the northern Médoc (St-Estèphe, Pauillac, St-Julien, and some Haut-Médoc) were the best wines produced. The cabernets planted in the clay soils did quite well; even some merlots in heavy soil did well. Some lighter soils in Margaux and in the Graves area, and especially in Pomerol and parts of St-Emilion did not have the water-holding capacity to keep the vines producing during the hot summer. But do not ignore the great properties from these areas, as fabulous wines were made at Château Margaux (our favorite wine of the tastings), Palmer, Haut Brion, Haut-Bailly, Pape-Clément, Cheval Blanc, etc, etc. Please do read our Vintage Report for all the details.

So what should you do? First of all, if you are at all interested in this vintage, get on the K&L waiting lists of your favorite wines. We already have some 100 wines in the system. Some wines have already opened, and we have prices for them. You will be under no obligation to buy the wine, but you will be notified when it is available, and then you can decide. This year's campaign could be short and sweet, so use the waiting list. Allocations may not be big with first tranche pricing

There are some "must buys" this year as some châteaux made their best wine EVER. Also, I hope we can offer the First Growths for \$149-\$159 at first tranche. If so, buy all you can afford! Have you noticed the prices of 2000s lately? And these 2003s are every bit as good. —*Clyde Beffa, Jr*

Jim C's View Down Under

Well, it's my first day back at work after a great trip to South Africa, which you will hear about next month. But for the moment, after almost 30 hours in a plane, my back is killing me and Shaun (our manager) needs me on the sales floor, so this is going to be quick and to the point.

From Australia we have three new arrivals, two for value and early consumption and one that will reward moderate cellar time. The 2002 Wirra Wirra "Scrubby Rise" Shiraz (\$8.99) from McLaren Vale is easy drinking with black fruits, smoky Northern Rhône meatiness and a hint of pepper. The **2003 Wishing Tree Shiraz (\$8.99)**, from Western Australia, has a lovely bouquet of blackberry, licorice and a light meaty note. On the palate, the wine is juicy with good balance and length. The 2001 "Yalumba Hand Picked" Shiraz-Viognier (\$24.99) from Eden Valley is the counterpart to the "MGS" that we sold earlier this year Parker has not yet rated this wine, but the 2000 got 91 points, and I suspect this will be higher. Someone once described a wine to me as "a big boy that can dance," and I think those words apply here. While there is considerable power, the combination of viognier with the character of Eden Valley fruit offers great aromatic lift and a supple texture. The nose is quite perfumed with smoky boysenberry, cassis, licorice, tar and a light floral note. These elements come together with a creamy texture and a hint of spice that are balanced and lead to a long finish. Limited quantities. And what the heck, here's one from New Zealand. You know it, you love it and you can't live with out it: the 2003 Konrad Sauvignon Blanc (\$14.99) from Marlborough. It's the new vintage with a new label, but there is still that great vibrant fruit with loads of grapefruit and lime-laced cantaloupe that refreshes with every sip. —Jim Chanteloup

A couple of wines we received right after I left sold out before I even returned. It seems the lull we had in California Cabernet between 1998 and 2000 has generated even more excitement then the normal hype of a great vintage. People have been starved for great California Cabernet! How does this affect buyers? The market is transitioning from a "buyers market" to a "sellers market." The word "Allocations" will be used a lot more, and items will sell out much faster than we have been accustomed to over the last several years. If you snooze you loose, as they say. What am I doing to help? I am doing my best to create items in our system ahead of time. The prices in the system will be based on the last release price and may not be accurate. Having these items in our system ahead of time will allow you to sign up for email notifications when the wine arrives. It will also provide ETAs on specific items. As far as some super buys we have in stock right now in the "value" category, don't miss the following wines:

2001 B.R. Cohn California Cabernet Sauvignon (\$12.99): soft, fresh and full of fruit, this wine shows hints of minerals, sweet herbs and spice; 2001 Kalinda Alexander Valley Cabernet Sauvignon (\$17.99): from the S.....r Vineyard, packed with flavors of plums, currants and vanilla; 2001 Louis Martini Sonoma Cabernet Sauvignon (\$10.99): value!

The prices for these wines also have exploded lately. I've scoured our offerings for some of the best deals the vintage has to offer, keeping it under \$20.

2001 Hess Select California Cabernet (\$11.99) Always a value, Hess sources the best grape deals from around the state. At \$11.99 this 2001 is an unbelievable deal. Loaded with blackberry/raspberry fruit, notes of spices and pepper, touches of oak and a round luscious mouthfeel with just enough tannin. This year they added 10% syrah, and a touch of merlot to really bring out the ripe fruit character.

2001 Franciscan Oakville Estate Napa Cabernet (\$18.98) Spicy black cherry and deep plum fruit, toasty oak, cedar box and a round plump middle dusted with fine tannins...who wouldn't like this wine? Here's a great example of Napa Cab, from a fantastic vintage, and at just \$19. The Franciscan really gives a lot of complex characteristics in a beautifully integrated, very Californian Cab.

2001 Simi Alexander Valley Cabernet (\$17.99) Here's a wine that really shows off its Alexander Valley roots with a deep ruby intensity to the color, and ripe blueberry, cassis and black cherry aromas just bursting out of the glass. This is all followed by a supple plump mouthful of sweet ripe cherry jam and cassis syrup flavors mingled with smooth integrated oak. *Wine Spectator* gave it 92-94 points in their last (barrel) tasting. All for \$18! Cheers! —*Shaun Green*

This is a blend of merlot, cabernet franc and cabernet sauvignon with small amounts of malbec and petit verdot. Quality of a high-priced wine with great balance and depth, this wine is a must try.

2001 ZD Napa Cabernet (\$29.99) The nose is reminiscent of crushed blackberries, cassis, anise, vanilla, spice and little hint of earthiness with a solid oak finish. Aged in 100% American oak. This is a well balanced wine that can age for 3-5 years.

2001 Caymus Napa Cabernet (\$64.99) A marvelously rich and balanced wine with lots of currant, herbs and toasty oak. A real hit at the cabernet tasting earlier this year. Enjoy this while you wait on the Special Select to mature. 92 points from *Wine Spectator*.

2001 Joseph Phelps "Insignia" Pre Arrival (\$99.99) This wine, which arrives in the fall, is one of the most anticipated wines of the vintage. 95 points from Robert Parker: "...an inky/purple-colored effort representing a return to the superb quality of such vintages as 1997. Aged in 100% new French oak, this blockbuster reveals gorgeous aromas of melted licorice, cassis, liquid minerals, and hints of chocolate and spice. The finish is long, full-bodied, considerable tannin is largely concealed by the lavish richness..." See you in the City.

Condes Report: Bordeaux Values

A wine on which to reflect, the **1993 Léoville-Barton (\$39.99)** is a true gem from a vintage that didn't receive a lot of attention. Aromas of cigar box, soft currants and spice occupy the nose. On the palate it is medium bodied, round textured and very balanced. The wine is meant to be consumed in the near term (now-2 years), and would pair very well with grilled meats.

From the 2000 vintage, here are a few unsung values: The **2000 Pibran, Pauillac (\$24.99)** comes from the same stable as the wines of Pichon-Baron and is made in the same tradition of its powerful cousin. This is not a second label; it definitely stands on its own. This wine has intense aromas of dark cherries, bright berries and a hint of fine vanilla. In the mouth it is BIG, chewy and rich with a finish that goes on for days. This wine can be enjoyed now or in 2-6 years. The **2000 Bois Martin (\$17.99)** is the princess of Pessac-Léognan. This wine has lovely aromas of violets, raspberries and hints of plum. The wine tends to lean away from the earthy style of Graves to the more feminine with grace and finesse, and it drinks like it smells: soft entry into the palate, very smooth with flavors that keep you coming back for more. A wine with true pedigree that is meant for near to mid-term consumption (now-4 years). The **2000 Plaisance "Cuvee Alix" Premieres Côtes de Bordeaux (\$14.99)** comes from the east bank of the Garonne River. The wine is not too far apart in style from those from the Graves. This is a real bargain, showing aromas of dark-chocolate-covered cherries, cassis and spice. On the palate this reminds me of those great wines from St-Julien that are sexy and powerful, but this one has the charm to drink now.

With all the hype about 2000, 2001 has been overlooked. 2001 is for the true Bordeaux lover, and many of the wines represent truly great values! St-Emilion has rebounded to make charming, elegant wines across the board. Angélus in particular is stunning. In the Médoc there are many fantastic wines: Cos d'Estournel, Léoville-Barton, and Pichon-Lalande (where the managing director told me that it is one of the best they've made in his 20+ years). Bordeaux 2003: Mother Nature Turned up the Heat!

Unlike the weather in California, where you can pretty much count on fine quality and ripeness every year, Bordeaux struggles to get ripeness and 12% alcohol almost every year because of its cooler and much more turbulent climate.

When my wife Kim and I arrived in Bordeaux on Sunday, June 22, 2003 (at 6 pm) the temperature was well over 90 degrees. It was the 26th day of a heat wave that had gripped the region. The previous day it had been 116 degrees in downtown Bordeaux—an all time record. The vineyards and all the residents were ready for some cooler weather; little did they know they would have to wait 66 more days (a total of 92 days) until they got some much-needed relief. This heat wave will always be 2003's moniker. (Please see Clyde's Vintage Report with our tasting notes for the complete rundown and the explanation for how the unique microclimate of Bordeaux enabled the vines to survive and produce some great wines in these challenging conditions.)

Hot weather vintages in France are normally very good to great quality vintages, and I was ready to taste wines wines that were full of ripeness and sweet fruit. I was wrong. In 2003 there is surely lots of ripeness, but sweet fruit is only found in the greatest of the wines. Yes, there are some truly great ones, but sadly only a few dozen. The great wines are big and powerful, loaded with fruit, amazing complexity and possess "un zeste pendant la vie!" I believe that it is for these wines that the vintage of 2003 will always be remembered and will capture the excitement and reverence of wine lovers in America for many decades to come. The great wines are concentrated in the Médoc with very few stars coming from the right bank and the Graves. Luckily, Sauternes are fat and delicious!

We always have to remember that wine is a subjective form of art, and these wines are just babies. But this is how I break it down.

Classics/Wines of the Vintage: Latour: power and sweet richness;

Margaux: perfection!

Outstanding (just a touch underneath the above wines at this point in time, though any of these could possibly jump up into that category): Lafite-Rothschild: sweet ripe grapes, violets, round in the mouth, tasty; Mouton-Rothschild: strong fruit, ripe and tight; Léoville-Las-Cases: deep, strong and defined, roses and violets; Cheval Blanc: not quite as deep as 2000, but fantastic; Angélus: deep, exotic, fat with structure, jammy, dark chocolate, balanced: Palmer: deep, sweet and firm, fine definition; Cos d'Estournel: ripe, so tasty, with a powerful finish; Pichon-Longueville Comtesse-de-Lalande: elegant, coffee/toasty, spicey; Ducru Beacaillou: flashy, grapey, elegant and long, impressive; Pape-Clément: high-toned deep fruit, silky but strong.

Also outstanding and usually priced very fairly, and because of that deserve special attention as they are the great values in this vintage: **Pontet-Canet:** outstanding purity, loaded with dark fruit, serious; **Léoville-Barton:** tremendous amounts of dark blue fruit, keeps it all together in a powerful package; **Lynch-Bages:** plenty of dark red/black fruit and oak; **Pichon-Longueville-Baron:** strong, deep and a touch exotic; **Clerc-Milon** and **d'Armaillac** round out a killer trio of wines from the Mouton barn, all exceptional; **Kirwan:** big, full of cassis and lush; **Malescot:** strong, dark, good guts! Nice to see it back in form; **Haut-Bailly:** good soft fruit on entry, strong finish; **Smith-Haut-Lafitte Rouge:** nice rounded fruit, balanced and tasty.

The super value wines: **Cambon la Pelouse, Sociando Mallet, Pedesclaux, Clauzet** and **Potensac.**

2001 Viña Alarba Garnacha, Calatayud (\$5.99) The Viña Alarba is a dense thick red with loads of ripe blackberry fruit and tons of punch. Made from a blend of 90% garnacha and 10% syrah, these grapes come from vineyards that are planted at anywhere from 2,100 to 3,000 ft. in elevation and are at least 20-years old.

2002 Agramont "Old Vine" Garnacha, Navarra (\$6.99) The Agramont comes from Navarra, which is north of Calatayud and next to Rioja. Once again our feature grape is garnacha from vines that are over 100-years old. This red has tons of bright berry fruit, pepper spice, and a long finish with good acidity and ripe tannins. Enjoy this with a Navarra classic, grilled trout stuffed with Serrano ham.

1998 Viña Alberdi, La Rioja Alta, Rioja Reserva (\$18.99)

1996 Viña Ardanza, La Rioja Alta, Rioja Reserva (\$29.99)

La Rioja Alta, founded in 1890, is one of the most revered wineries in all of Spain. All of their wines are aged in 100% American oak and are made according to the traditional methods in Rioja. The '98 Alberdi is made from a blend of 95% tempranillo and 5% mazuelo. Aged for two years in cask and 1-1/2 years in the bottle, the Alberdi is still bright and youthful with loads of blackcurrant and cherry fruit. From the aromas of vanilla and spice cake in the nose to the lengthy finish, it is a red of style and breed. Reserva Rioja doesn't get any better than this at this truly value price! The 1996 Ardanza is a stunning red wine. Made from a blend of tempranillo with about 20% garnacha, the Ardanza was pretty tightly wound when we first opened it, revealing the classic cacao and vanillin nose of fine Rioja. After a few hours, the wine opened to show its currant and berry fruit with suppleness from the oak aging and plenty of glycerin from the garnacha.

2001 Val Llach, Priorat (\$65.99) Run, don't walk to pick up some of this very limited production Priorat. Made from a blend of old-vine carignan with a little merlot and cabernet sauvignon, the Val Llach is a thick and juicy red full of ripe black currant and blackberry flavors with aromas of star anise and vanillin oak. Don't wait for Parker to score this 96 points like he did the 2000. -Anne Pickett

As we gently ease our way towards the summer months, a wonderful selection of great buys and cellar stars are available for May.

2000 Côtes du Rhône, "Cuvee Classique," Rene Emmanuel (\$8.99) Aromas of raspberries and anise with sweet boysenberry/raspberry fruit and white pepper and licorice in the mouth. A dry, pleasant finish with additional pepper and fresh, new oak. Great with barbecue.

2001 Castelmaure, Corbieres "Grand Cuvee" (\$14.99) Heady aromas of violets and fresh cut flowers mingle with ripe, black fruits. On the palate, new oak, blackberries, black cherries and a nice bit of minerality. This is a must with extra sharp cheeses, spicy beef or pork.

2000 Côteaux de Languedoc, "Grand Cuvee," Domaine de l'Hortus (\$15.99) Initially, aromas of oak, tobacco, coffee and roasted meats. After a few minutes, these scents taper off to boysenberry fruit and cherry. In the mouth, dark cherry fruit with cranberry, mineral and cola notes. As with the Castelmaure, a bigger style but also balanced and elegant. A perfect match with roasted leg of lamb with rosemary.

2001 Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Cabrieres "Cuvee Louis Arnaud" (\$69.99) Huge, huge and dense! Unfiltered. Black fruit scents with nutmeg and cinnamon spice. Dark, black, plum fruit in the mouth with black cherries, cinnamon and decadent chocolate. A perfect candidate for the cellar for the next 2-16 years. Robert Parker gave this beauty 92-94 points. -Scott Beckerley

I am happy to announce the arrival this month of one of my absolute favorite German Rieslings. The **2003 Josef Leitz Rüdesheimer Drachenstein "Dragonstone" Riesling (\$14.99)**, as it is now known in the U.S., is finally here. This is one of the first of the highly anticipated '03s to hit the shelves, and it is a perennial favorite here at K&L. There is not enough space to list all of the accolades bestowed upon this wine in past vintages, but David Schildknecht who writes for Tanzer's International Wine Cellar sums it up well by proclaiming it as "the greatest Riesling value anywhere." Our own Eric Story was in Germany last year for the harvest and helped to bring this wine into existence, Johannes jokes and calls it the Ericstone in his honor.

This most perfect of summer wines is already sold out at the winery, and this gem will be gone from our shelves soon after it hits these shores. Johannes Leitz is a man concerned with value and with making a wine people can afford to drink that is delicious and yet still speaks of his village and the great vineyards on the hill of Rudesheim. The 2003 Dragonstone is rippling with zingy grapefruit and current aromas with a haunting whiff of spice. It is a bit richer this year due to the warm growing season, but still refreshing and lively on the palate with all the elegance you have come to expect from this wine. A fine example and still the best darn bottle of Riesling you can buy at this price. Happy to be here. —Jeff Vierra

Ausgezeichnet Austria!

In this newsletter we feature a relatively new Austrian winemaker who has now firmly entered the elite circle of quality-driven producers: Michael Moosbrugger of **Schloss Gobelsburg**. Although the estate is 1000-years old and has been owned by the Abbey of Zwettl for the last 400 years, the wines from their outstanding vineyards have consistently under performed. It was not until Michael leased the estate in 1996 that the full potential of the vineyards became realized, especially in the two most recent vintages (2001/2002) where hauntingly beautiful wines were made. This is a combination hard to resist: a prodigy winemaker, a historic estate, some of the best vineyards in the area, a pair of stellar back-to-back vintages and low pricing relative to the "discovered" elite. Pray the masses do not "discover" Schloss Gobelsburg.

2001 Hirtzberger Grüner "Rotes Tor" Smaragd-94 pts, Falstaff..\$34.99

2001 Schloss Gobelsburg Grüner Veltliner "Kammerner Renner" (**\$19.99**) Ripe apples, juicy citrus fruits, hints of legumes and spice. Classic Grüner. Like liquid velvet yet so focused and precise.

2002 Schloss Gobelsburg Grüner Veltliner "Steinsetz" (\$17.99) Very floral on the nose and quite broad on the palate, with riper peach and citrus fruits competing for your attention.

Mulan's Musings

Upon hearing from my mother that I was developing a keen interest, or perhaps obsession with food and wine, Marcel's eyes got really, really big. You see, there are three things that my uncle Marcel absolutely adores: Food, wine and tennis. So naturally my mother's revelation was music to his ears. Seized by a sudden fit of inspiration, Marcel decided to forego tennis (and work) in order to prepare a fabulous Provencal dinner. A re-cap of the evening's menu follows below. I have taken the liberty of recommending a new wine with each course.

First up, Marcel's moules aux epinards (baked mussels filled with spinach and mushrooms). The **2002 Domaine des Terres Blanches Coteaux d'Aix en Provence (\$11.99)** would complement this dish beautifully. Composed of grenache blanc, ugni blanc and rolle, this wine is fresh and nervy. However it's got enough stuffing to stand up to the earthy mushroom and spinach components of the dish. With the second course, a terrine de campagne (country pâté) I would enjoy

a glass of the 2000 Domaine de Grangeneuve "Vielles Vignes" Bour (\$10.99). This old-vine Rhône from Tricastin is composed of 50% syrah and 50% grenache. Aromas of crushed boysenberries and blueberries are pronounced, along with subtle hints of crushed rock minerality. Finalement, Marcel's chef d'oeuvre, a canard comme a Nice (stuffed duck roasted with tomato, white wine and olives). With this course I recommend the 2001 Lirac Chateau St. Roch (\$10.99). This grenache-based Lirac exhibits fragrances of raspberry, red plum and finishes with just a hint of spicebox. The elegant and bright nature of this wine makes it a perfect match with roast duck. The Adventures of Barrlock Holmes: The Hound Of the Barrskervilles

The night fell swiftly in the streets of London. Citizens hurried to and fro in an attempt to reach the safety of their homes as the gas lamps were being lit to ward off the descending darkness. At 221 B Baker Street the lamps had been ablaze much earlier, in an attempt to ward off the dull thoughts of the inhabitant. Sitting in high backed Naugahyde chair, playing his violin and reading the works of Leonardo Da Vinci upside down, was one of the most celebrated minds of his day: amateur detective, champion chess player, chemist, artist, boxer, Burt Bacharach collaborator (who isn't?), smoking his pipe, letting his sentences run on and on, a man whose name could only be Barrlock Holmes. Actually, his name could have been Fred or Dave or Randy, but it wasn't.

"Come in Watson!" Holmes bellowed, moments before the knock on the door. Dr. Watson was flabbergasted. "I am flabbergasted!" said Watson. But I told you that. "How did you know it was me?" "Elementary, my dear Watson." (There, we got that out of the way). "You limp slightly to the left, reek of gin, pick your nose, and you waved to me from the street." Watson harrumphed, poured some gin and picked at his nose. "There is a matter of grave urgency, my dear Watson" Holmes continued. "It seems that an evil wind blows in my home town of Barrskerville ("Evil wind indeed, must be a relative," muttered Watson). Come, Watson. The game's afoot! We'll discuss the ransom in the hansom."

On the road to Barrskerville (much later a famous Bob Hope movie) Holmes dives into detail; it seems that some rare older vintages of **Beaulieu Vineyards Private Reserve Cabernet** had been lifted straight from the winery and were holed up in Barrskerville, creating a shortage of good value older wine throughout the land. A cryptic ransom note was all the sleuth had to follow. It read: I am A/I have B/ I want C/The answer is under your nose." A pensive Holmes knew that he had not much time and not much upstairs. His mind drifted to the wines of Beaulieu: 1990, a classic California delight with cherry, cedar and American oak nuances, rich sweet fruit and perfectly integrated tannins; the 1991, a Bordeaux-style success, perfectly ready to drink from this great vintage; and the 1986, with its old-style label and new-world charm, firm in structure with a brightness and concentration that Barrlock could never hope to emulate. Dr. Watson sought to console his detective friend: "I say, Holmes, is there nothing that can come from my mouth that can lift the darkness from this beautiful place?" "Watson! You've done it again! Driver, we must hurry…"

In a matter of minutes the criminal was apprehended and the wine returned to the customers of K&L. As Watson donned his hat, he turned to Holmes and asked him how the case was cracked. "Elementary, my dear Watson. Remember the ransom note: A means the name begins with A; B stands for Beaulieu; and C is obviously cash; and the answer is under your nose means... mouth! That is what led us here to the mouth of the river Thames, in this beautiful place, which is what Beaulieu means in French!"

"What," Watson asked, "will happen to Anderson, the evil Hound of the Barrskervilles?" Holmes chuckled, putting his pipe on his head and a match to his deerstalker cap. "He'll go back to his master. That will be worse than any prison." —Joe Zugelder

Jim's May Gems

An interesting vintage year has been evolving up here in the North Coast. We have had gondola loads of rain this winter until early March, when the rain suddenly stopped and temperatures soared to the mid to high eighties virtually the next day. As I write this month's gems from my office that overlooks our Anderson Valley vineyard, it has been unseasonably warm for the last two and half weeks, which has resulted in serious budbreak with our baby vines. Some are even on their second and third leaf, clearly three or more weeks ahead of schedule. If I was to have a crop this year, I would be a bit nervous at this point. Frost is still a major problem this time of year and will be so for at least another six to eight weeks. Many growers are, I'm sure, faithfully watching the weather channel. Fortunately, we will not have our first crop until next year, so the only real issue that we face is how fast the trellising can be finished.

One of my favorite white wines last year (and there were a few) was our 2002 Kirkham Peak New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc, which received tons of high scores and marks from all the noted critics under the original winery's label. All of you agreed, and bought that wine in massive quantities. Well, the **2003 Kirkham Peak Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc (\$10.99)** is even better than the 2002. The 2003 crop size in Marlborough was reduced by 40% to 60% as a result of early frosts, which, in turn, created exceptionally low yields at harvest that produced incredibly concentrated, intense wines of classic proportions. This wonderful sauvignon blanc is a classic example of the vintage and explodes with opulent aromas of passion fruit and ripe, sweet grape-fruit. In the mouth, you will be treated to a profusion of flavors of white peach and nectarine fruit with bright, mouthwatering acidity and a lively, zippy finish. Ebby says not to ponder long on this one.

The great bargains coming from the exceptional 2000 Bordeaux vintage continue to astound me. There are truly some great deals to be had in this vintage from the much lesser growths and cru bourgeois as opposed to the super high prices of the classified growths. There is an old axiom that in great vintages the quality gap between great châteaux and all the rest shrinks dramatically. The **2000 Château Saint-Hilaire**, **Médoc (\$14.99)** is a perfect example of this fact. An equal blend of cabernet sauvignon and merlot aged in new oak, this excellent Médoc is deep red-ruby in color and oozes with ripe blackberry to currant fruit. This puppy is complex, exhibiting outstanding structure, depth, and viscosity, soft tannins and a long, warm finish. Although drinking well now with airing, it should easily age beyond 2010. (******) What has quickly become an annual best buy, the **2001 Castell dei**

Finally, the **2001 Châteaux de Myrat Sauternes (375ml, \$17.99)** is a stunning example of this exquisite, near perfect Sauternes vintage. Loaded with botrytis, this little gem is the essence of honeysuckle and apricot with a splash of crème brulée, but is not cloying or cumbersome due to its bright acidity. Although it is capable of aging forever, drink it whenever you desire, particularly with foie gras. Ebby and Anderson are arguing with each other as to whose selection this should be for the month. (

Ask me about what's new!

By the time this newsletter arrives in your hands I'll be back from my annual buying trip to Champagne. My plan this month is to take some time to deliver a detailed vintage report on the unprecedented 2003 harvest and introduce you to some of our new producers. 2003 certainly was a very interesting growing season: The worst frost since the 1950s severely limited the crop, and the hottest summer in living memory produced the earliest harvest since the 1850s! I am extremely excited to taste the 2003 vin clair (Champagne that has not yet been made sparkling), especially since the growers seem so excited to present it.

I will also have the opportunity to visit with one of the very best producers in Bouzy, **Champagne Andre Clouet**, as well as an extraordinary, bio-dynamic estate, **Champagne Leclerc-Briant**. Leclerc-Briant produces three single-vineyard Champagnes (Les Chevres Pierreuses, Les Crayeres and the tiny, walled Le Clos des Champions) from their holdings in the village of Cumieres. All of them are very highly regarded and sought after within Champagne. I will be visiting Verzenay, the northernmost Grand Cru in Champagne (and in France, for that matter) to meet with a number of the best producers there. Verzenay is one of the most distinctive terroirs in Champagne, and importing one of its finest producers at direct pricing is one of the main objectives for this trip.

I am also hoping to talk Mr. **Rene Collard** out of a few more cases from his 50-foot-deep cellar of old vintage treasures. If you have not had his iconoclastic meunier Champagnes before this will be a rare opportunity. He has only exported once before, and usually his old vintages do not even travel as far as Paris. They will go very fast when they arrive. Last time I was able to offer 1990, 1985, 1979, 1976 and 1975 vintages. I wonder what he might have this time!

Unfortunately, many of these wines will never again appear in the pages of this newsletter. The small production and limited availability will insure that some will sell out before there is time to publish the news of their arrival. Below is a smattering of what is really exciting at the moment.

2002 François Chidaine Montlouis, Clos Habert Demi-Sec (\$18.99) The grapes for this 100% chenin blanc off dry cuvée come from 60year-old vines. Chidaine likes to harvest very late for this wine, sometimes at a potential degree of 14% alcohol. Its earthy, mineral-scented bouquet is followed by sweet pear flavors and gripping acidity.

2002 Jean Michel Sorbe Reuilly Blanc "Le Commanderie" (\$10.99) 100% sauvignon blanc from south-west of Sancerre. Gorgeous aromas of tangerine, candied orange and wet stone with weight and silkiness on the palate and a tangy finish of mineral and chalk.

2000 Charles Baur Gewürztraminer, Grand Cru, Eichberg (\$18.99) This is a very classy style of Gewürztraminer that displays vibrant, refreshing acidity. It is never cloying, yet still pungently spicy. Enjoy!

Pour Votre Plaisir Back from Burgundy

As I write this, I am just back from 10 days in Burgundy, where I got the chance to taste hundreds of wines from 2001, 2002 and barrel samples from 2003. I'll report on 2003 in my June column.

2002 reminds me a great deal of 1985, with rich and very charming fruit, relatively lower acidities and soft tannins. While not a vintage for cellaring for 20 years, it will provide a great deal of pleasure over the next 10-12 years. It was successful in many parts of Burgundy. However, it was not a vintage like 1999 where conditions were so perfect that the wines made themselves. It is one where the skill of the winegrower and winemaker shows very clearly.

The biggest surprise was how well many vintners' 2001s were showing on this trip. While I have liked the vintage a great deal, it was a difficult one to evaluate in its infancy. The very high malic acids made the wines seem austere and less generous with their fruit than they really were. As the wines have spent an additional year in bottle, they have not only shed the fiercest of their tannins, but have gained density and fruit. They remind me of the 1993 vintage and are showing extraordinary promise for the cellar.

One example of excellent 2001s was at **Domaine Hubert Lignier**. His wines are rich and complete, without getting too extracted or jammy. The **2001 Chambolle-Musigny** (**\$46.99**) has finesse, elegance and loads of charm. The **2001 Morey-St-Denis**, **1er Cru**, **VV** (**\$99.95**) is in perfect balance with stunning power and gentle tannins. The **2001 Gevrey-Chambertin**, "**Combottes**," **1er Cru**, (**\$117.99**) Burghound calls "absolutely exquisite" and "utterly seductive." I agree. The **2001 Clos de la Roche (\$146.99**) is classy, powerful, long and simply stunning. A Santé. —*Keith Wollenberg*

I just returned from a week in the Langhe hills with Mike Parres tasting the much-heralded 2000 Barolo, a vintage given 100 points by the *Wine Spectator*, and I can honestly say I was very skeptical and thought they would merely be overripe. Well, they are really very good, even amongst the star-studded string of glorious vintages '96-'97-'98-'99-'00-'01. The 2000 vintage has less evident tannins than the 1996, more balance than 1997, deeper, more structured and richer than 1998 and more finesse than 1999. I'd say for someone looking to get into Barolo, 2000 is an easier vintage to understand and appreciate!

Mike and I ran into young Maurizio Anselma, fresh-faced, 26-years old and ready to take his family's wines to market. Not uncommon in an area where so many youngsters are taking their parents tiny vineyard plots (average vineyard holding in Barolo is about 3.5 acres) into the marketplace. Maurizio's family, the **Famiglia Anselma**, has been working on one simple concept for decades now: Buy more vineyards. His parents, Giovanna (vineyard manager) and Renato (winemaker), have worked relentlessly, sacrificed greatly, while gathering up choice parcels in Serralunga, Barolo and Monforte, where they now have about 140+ acres of Barolo vineyards. Yeah, that's not a typo. That's a lot of Barolo! Even more remarkable is the fact that they only make Barolo; no Barbera, no Dolcetto, no Nebbiolo d'Alba, just Barolo and

only Barolo. The Famiglia Anselma produce two wines: Barolo and Barolo "Adasi." Adasi is the Piemontese dialect for Adagio. In music as in wine it refers to a slow passage, and it is reserved for wines of power. As the pendulum swings back toward the traditional in Barolo and away from the multiple tiny vineyard designations, the Famiglia Anselma leads the way. They blend all of their vineyards together. In a musical analogy you can think of it as a choir rather than a solitary soprano, or an orchestra rather than a violin solo. They also waited to release until they had aged wine to sell. It is their plan to always have aged wine and at great prices. I'd start with trying their 1993 Famiglia Anselma Barolo (\$47.99), which is a classic representation of Barolo drinking superbly now. I'd follow it up by trying the 1995 Famiglia Anselma Barolo "Adasi" (\$53.99), which has a deeper tone, resonant and aromatic. The 1997 and 1998 Famiglia Anselma Barolo (both \$47.99) are dynamite wines that you can drink now or are age. The 1997 Famiglia Anselma Barolo "Adasi" (\$59.99) and the 1996 "Adasi" (\$55.99) are wines for your cellar: powerful yet graceful! For locals, Maurizio will be in our San Francisco store Thursday, May 13 from 4:30-6:30 and in our Redwood City store Saturday, May 15 from 1-4 to pour a vertical of all of his wines. Come in, taste the wines and meet this exciting young man! -Greg St. Clair

May Discoveries

In March Greg and I visited the **Cascina Val del Prete**, or little house in the valley of the priest, which takes its name from the exiled Bishop of Asti who lived there in 1850. I'm a big fan of this winery, and I very much enjoyed walking through their picturesque vineyards. The **2002 Cascina Val del Prete Roero Arneis "Luet" (\$14.99)** is a refreshing straw-yellow wine with delicate apricot and green apples notes on the nose and palate, and a rich roundness from the 40% French oak. The **2001 Cascina Val del Prete Barbera d'Alba Superiore "Carolina" (\$29.99)** is fresh with soft scents of ripe plums and vanilla. This fullbodied wine offers black cherries, cranberries and a touch of prune. Could stand the test of time if you can be patient.

My price performer this month is the **2001 Agostino Pavia Barbera d'Asti Bricco Blina (\$10.99)** Jam-packed with tangy red fruits, this carries a length and finish not usually associated with \$11 wines.

Last but not least is the **2001 Lenotti Bardolino Superiore "le Olle"** (**\$15.99**). This was served with a mushroom pastry at our staff holiday party, and it worked so well we have problems keeping it in stock. If our staff is not buying it they are selling it like crazy! Produced from the grapes corvina (65%), rondinella (25%) and cabernet sauvignon (10%). 30% of the grapes are dried, similar to top Valpolicellas. The taste is dry with spicy ripe fruit, complex, savory, full-bodied and velvety. Thanks for the suggestion Greg. Salute! —*Mike Parres*
